According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “checklist” as a noun can have the following definitions:

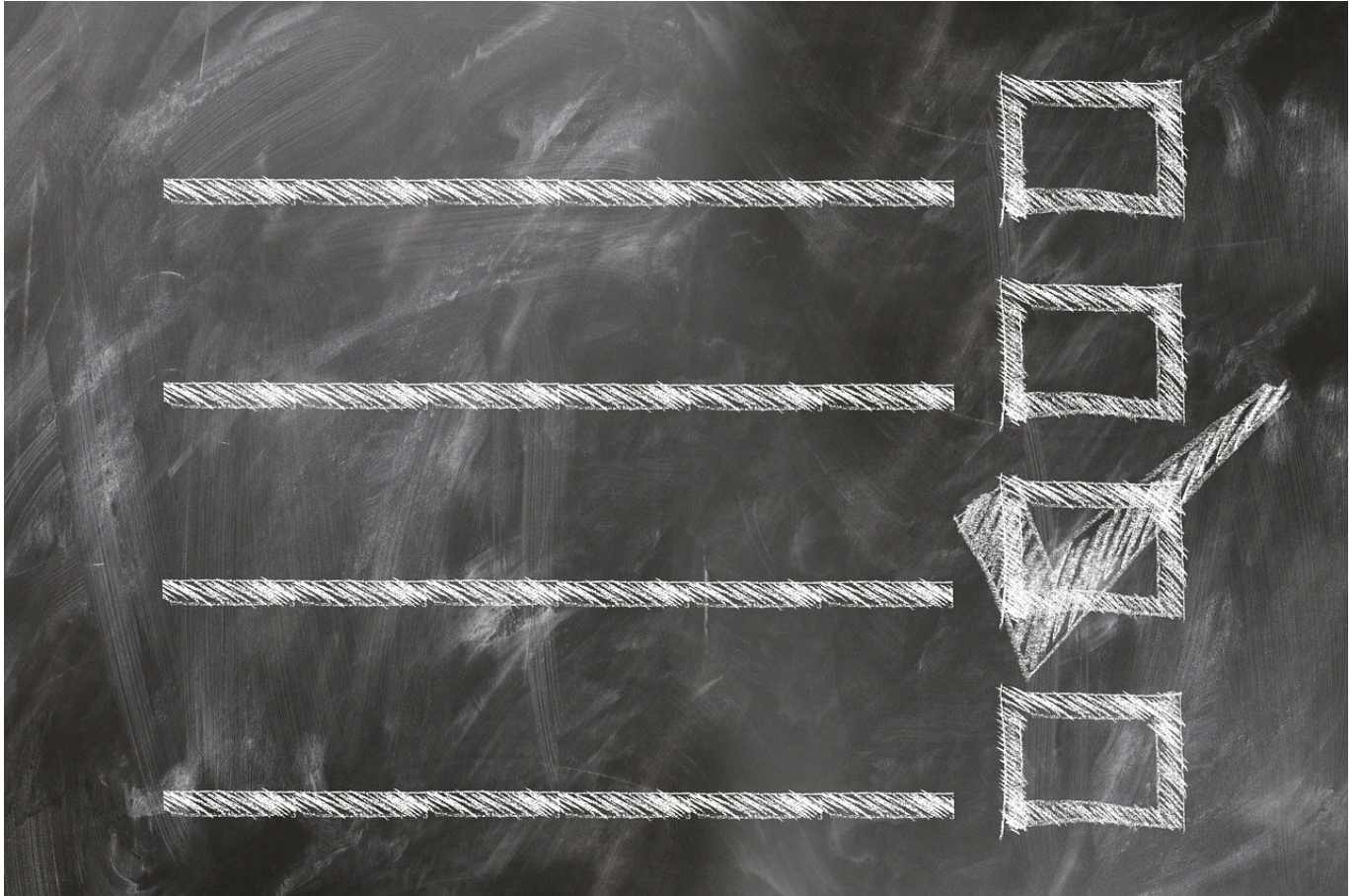
- *A list of items (names or tasks etc.) to be checked or consulted.*
- *A list of items required, things to be done, or points to be considered, used as a reminder.*



## Synonyms of "Checklist" as a noun (16 Words)

- catalogue** A complete list of items, typically one in alphabetical or other systematic order.  
*His life was a **catalogue** of dismal failures.*
- directory** A listing of the files stored in memory (usually on a hard disk).
- docket** A voucher entitling the holder to receive or obtain delivery of goods ordered.  
*One new case on the **docket** from Florida.*
- enumeration** The act of counting; reciting numbers in ascending order.  
*It is not necessary to give an exhaustive **enumeration** of the circumstances.*
- file** A steel hand tool with small sharp teeth on some or all of its surfaces; used for smoothing wood or metal.  
*You can save the **file** to your hard disk.*

<a href="#"><u>index</u></a>	<p>An alphabetical listing of names and topics along with page numbers where they are discussed. <i>The oral hygiene <b>index</b> was calculated as the sum of the debris and calculus indices.</i></p>
<b>inventory</b>	<p>The value of a firm's current assets including raw materials and work in progress and finished goods. <i>They carried a vast <b>inventory</b> of hardware.</i></p>
<b>listicle</b>	<p>A piece of writing or other content presented wholly or partly in the form of a list. <i>A recent BuzzFeed <b>listicle</b> called 21 Pictures That Will Restore Your Faith in Humanity has attracted more than 13 million views.</i></p>
<b>listing</b>	<p>The drawing up of a list.</p>
<b>record</b>	<p>Anything such as a document or a phonograph record or a photograph providing permanent evidence of or information about past events. <i>I'm listening to <b>records</b> in my room.</i></p>
<a href="#"><u>register</u></a>	<p>A cashbox with an adding machine to register transactions used in shops to add up the bill. <i>I had signed the <b>register</b> with my new name.</i></p>
<b>roll</b>	<p>A gymnastic exercise in which a person tucks their head down and rolls their body in a forward or backwards circle on the floor. <i>A <b>roll</b> of mints.</i></p>
<b>table</b>	<p>A list of rivals or competitors showing their positions relative to one another a league table. <i>The negotiating <b>table</b>.</i></p>
<b>tabulation</b>	<p>The act of putting into tabular form. <i>The <b>tabulation</b> of the results.</i></p>
<a href="#"><u>tally</u></a>	<p>An account kept by means of a tally. <i>The key is so cut as to form a <b>tally</b> with the interior machinery.</i></p>
<a href="#"><u>ticket</u></a>	<p>(in information technology) a request logged on a work tracking system detailing an issue that needs to be addressed or task that must be performed. <i>Companies that appeared to have a one way <b>ticket</b> to profitability.</i></p>

<b>ad</b>	An advertisement. <i>The latest television lager <b>ad</b>.</i>
<b><u>benchmark</u></b>	Give particular results during a benchmark test. <i>The device should <b>benchmark</b> at between 100 and 150 MHz.</i>
<b><u>book</u></b>	A bookmaker's record of bets accepted and money paid out. <i>A pattern <b>book</b>.</i>
<b>booklet</b>	A small book usually having a paper cover.
<b>brochure</b>	A small book or magazine containing pictures and information about a product or service. <i>A holiday <b>brochure</b>.</i>
<b>catalog</b>	Make a catalogue compile a catalogue. <i>He found it in the Sears <b>catalog</b>.</i>

<b>confirm</b>	Administer the religious rite of confirmation to. <i>If these fears are <b>confirmed</b> the outlook for the economy will be dire.</i>
<b>correct</b>	Correct in opinion or judgment. <i>The <b>correct</b> version.</i>
<b><u>data</u></b>	A collection of facts from which conclusions may be drawn. <i>Statistical <b>data</b>.</i>
<b>encyclopedia</b>	A book or set of books giving information on many subjects or on many aspects of one subject and typically arranged alphabetically.
<b><u>file</u></b>	File a formal charge against. <i><b>File</b> for divorce.</i>
<b>folder</b>	A folding cover or holder, typically made of stiff paper or card, for storing loose papers.
<b>handbook</b>	A book giving information such as facts on a particular subject or instructions for operating a machine. <i>The <b>handbook</b> says an alkaline battery should be good for around 2000 hours of continuous performance.</i>
<b>handout</b>	A quantity of financial or other material aid given to a person or organization. <i>Dependence on central government <b>handouts</b>.</i>
<b><u>index</u></b>	List in an index. <i>Clear cross references supplemented by a thorough <b>index</b>.</i>
<b>inventory</b>	A quantity of merchandise or goods held in stock. <i>They held an <b>inventory</b> every month.</i>
<b>leaflet</b>	Distribute leaflets to people or an area. <i>Tourists visiting the area are being <b>leafleted</b>.</i>
<b>list</b>	Be on a list of products at a specified price. <i>Consult the <b>list</b> of drugs on page 326.</i>
<b>page</b>	The material written or printed on a page. <i>He was turning the <b>pages</b> of his Sunday newspaper.</i>
<b>pamphlet</b>	Distribute pamphlets to. <i>A handful of heritage minded citizens who <b>pamphleted</b> their neighbours.</i>
<b>pamphleteer</b>	Write and issue political or controversial pamphlets. <i>The right to <b>pamphleteer</b> and post bills anonymously is as important today as it was three centuries ago.</i>

<b>paper</b>	Apply wallpaper to a wall or room. <i>Murdoch owns many newspapers.</i>
<b>poster</b>	Put up posters in an area. <i>A <b>poster</b> advertised the coming attractions.</i>
<b><u>questionnaire</u></b>	A form containing a set of questions; submitted to people to gain statistical information.
<b><u>roster</u></b>	Place on or assign according to a duty roster. <i>The locomotive is <b>rostered</b> for service on Sunday.</i>
<b>specifier</b>	Someone who draws up specifications giving details (as for obtaining a patent).
<b>stationery</b>	Paper cut to an appropriate size for writing letters; usually with matching envelopes. <i>A range of <b>stationery</b>.</i>
<b><u>tab</u></b>	Identify as being of a specified type or suitable for a specified position. <i>He was <b>tabbed</b> by the President as the next Republican National Committee chairman.</i>
<b>tilt</b>	Charge with a tilt. <i><b>Tilting</b> the camera causes convergence of upright lines.</i>
