Associations of "Checkpoint" (30 Words)

armed	Furnished with bristles and thorns. <i>Heavily armed troops.</i>
arms	Weapons considered collectively. <i>Arms and ammunition.</i>
battlefield	A place or situation of strife or conflict. <i>They made a tour of Civil War battlefields.</i>
battleground	A region where a battle is being (or has been) fought.
besiege	Cause to feel distressed or worried. <i>She was besieged by so many problems that she got discouraged.</i>
cantonment	A military garrison or camp.
clampdown	Sudden restriction on an activity. <i>A clampdown on crime.</i>
conscription	Compulsory enlistment for state service, typically into the armed forces. <i>Conscription was extended to married men.</i>
constable	A police officer.
convoy	A procession of land vehicles traveling together. <i>American destroyers helped to convoy much needed supplies to Britain in 1917 18.</i>
cop	Incur (something unwelcome). <i>An easy journey if we don't cop any rough weather.</i>
cordon	Prevent access to or from an area or building by surrounding it with police or other guards. <i>The city centre was cordoned off after fires were discovered in two stores.</i>
detective	A police officer who investigates crimes. <i>Detective work.</i>
dragnet	A conical fishnet dragged through the water at great depths. <i>Caught in the police dragnet.</i>

fed	Any federal law enforcement officer.
felonious	Relating to or of the nature of felony. <i>Felonious</i> intent.
<u>fortress</u>	A person or thing not susceptible to outside influence or disturbance. <i>He had proved himself to be a fortress of moral rectitude.</i>
gendarme	A paramilitary police officer in France and other French-speaking countries. <i>He was hauled off by a gendarme to the police station.</i>
investigate	Investigate scientifically. <i>Future studies will investigate whether long term use of the drugs could prevent cancer.</i>
investigation	The action of investigating something or someone; formal or systematic examination or research. <i>A murder investigation.</i>
<u>investigator</u>	A scientist who devotes himself to doing research. <i>Accident investigators are at the crash site.</i>
junta	A deliberative or administrative council in Spain or Portugal. <i>The country's ruling military junta.</i>
<u>military</u>	Characteristic of or associated with soldiers or the military. <i>As a young man he joined the military and pursued a career in the Army.</i>
munition	Supply with munitions. <i>It never had the defence industry necessary to equip or munition its forces.</i>
<u>patrol</u>	Maintain the security of by carrying out a patrol. <i>Break the Cubs into sixes and Scouts into patrols.</i>
penalize	Put at an unfair disadvantage. <i>Section twenty penalizes possession of a firearm when trespassing.</i>
police	The force of policemen and officers. <i>The regulations will be policed by factory inspectors.</i>
<u>security</u>	Procedures followed or measures taken to ensure the security of a state or organization. <i>A matter of national security.</i>
<u>warlike</u>	Suggesting war or military life. <i>A warlike clan.</i>
weaponry	Weapons considered collectively. <i>America's weaponry.</i>
