<a href="#">armed</a>	Furnished with bristles and thorns. <i>Heavily <b>armed</b> troops.</i>
arms	Weapons considered collectively. <i><b>Arms</b> and ammunition.</i>
battlefield	A place or situation of strife or conflict. <i>They made a tour of Civil War <b>battlefields</b>.</i>
battleground	A region where a battle is being (or has been) fought.
<a href="#">besiege</a>	Cause to feel distressed or worried. <i>She was <b>besieged</b> by so many problems that she got discouraged.</i>
cantonment	A military garrison or camp.
clampdown	Sudden restriction on an activity. <i>A <b>clampdown</b> on crime.</i>
<a href="#">conscription</a>	Compulsory enlistment for state service, typically into the armed forces. <i><b>Conscription</b> was extended to married men.</i>
constable	A police officer.
convoy	A procession of land vehicles traveling together. <i>American destroyers helped to <b>convoy</b> much needed supplies to Britain in 1917 18.</i>
cop	Incur (something unwelcome). <i>An easy journey if we don't <b>cop</b> any rough weather.</i>
cordon	Prevent access to or from an area or building by surrounding it with police or other guards. <i>The city centre was <b>cordoned</b> off after fires were discovered in two stores.</i>
<a href="#">detective</a>	A police officer who investigates crimes. <i><b>Detective</b> work.</i>
dragnet	A conical fishnet dragged through the water at great depths. <i>Caught in the police <b>dragnet</b>.</i>

<b>fed</b>	Any federal law enforcement officer.
<b>felonious</b>	Relating to or of the nature of felony. <b>Felonious</b> intent.
<b>fortress</b>	A person or thing not susceptible to outside influence or disturbance. <i>He had proved himself to be a <b>fortress</b> of moral rectitude.</i>
<b>gendarme</b>	A paramilitary police officer in France and other French-speaking countries. <i>He was hauled off by a <b>gendarme</b> to the police station.</i>
<b>investigate</b>	Investigate scientifically. <i>Future studies will <b>investigate</b> whether long term use of the drugs could prevent cancer.</i>
<b>investigation</b>	The action of investigating something or someone; formal or systematic examination or research. <i>A murder <b>investigation</b>.</i>
<b>investigator</b>	A scientist who devotes himself to doing research. <i>Accident <b>investigators</b> are at the crash site.</i>
<b>junta</b>	A deliberative or administrative council in Spain or Portugal. <i>The country s ruling military <b>junta</b>.</i>
<b>military</b>	Characteristic of or associated with soldiers or the military. <i>As a young man he joined the <b>military</b> and pursued a career in the Army.</i>
<b>munition</b>	Supply with munitions. <i>It never had the defence industry necessary to equip or <b>munition</b> its forces.</i>
<b>patrol</b>	Maintain the security of by carrying out a patrol. <i>Break the Cubs into sixes and Scouts into <b>patrols</b>.</i>
<b>penalize</b>	Put at an unfair disadvantage. <i>Section twenty <b>penalizes</b> possession of a firearm when trespassing.</i>
<b>police</b>	The force of policemen and officers. <i>The regulations will be <b>policed</b> by factory inspectors.</i>
<b>security</b>	Procedures followed or measures taken to ensure the security of a state or organization. <i>A matter of national <b>security</b>.</i>
<b>warlike</b>	Suggesting war or military life. <i>A <b>warlike</b> clan.</i>
<b>weaponry</b>	Weapons considered collectively. <i>America s <b>weaponry</b>.</i>
