- Hackneyed and obviously sentimental.
- Of very poor quality; flimsy.
- Cheap and of low quality.
- (of a smile) exaggerated and likely to be insincere.

banal So lacking in originality as to be obvious and boring.

Songs with **banal** repeated words.

cheap Charging low prices.

A **cheap** restaurant.

chintzy Of, like, or decorated with chintz.

A chintzy salary increase.

clichéd Repeated regularly without thought or originality.

commonplace Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse. *Unemployment was commonplace* in his trade.

Unwell.

crummy A crummy little room.

fatuous Extremely silly or stupid.

A fatuous comment.



feeble Lacking bodily or muscular strength or vitality.

A feeble old woman.

hackneved Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse.

Hackneyed old sayings.

inane Extremely silly or stupid.

Don t badger people with **inane** questions.

jejune Of insufficient quantity to meet a need.

Their entirely predictable and usually **jejune** opinions.

Used to excess.

overworked Overworked nurses do not have time to adequately prepare patients for

discharge.

(of a remark or statement) used too often to be interesting or thoughtful;

platitudinous hackneyed.

This may sound **platitudinous**.

Able to be predicted.

The market is volatile and never **predictable**.

Relating to punk rock and its associated subculture.

punk

I felt too punk to eat.

stale (of food) no longer fresh and pleasant to eat; hard, musty, or dry.

A top executive tends to get **stale**.

stereotyped Lacking spontaneity or originality or individuality.

The film is weakened by its **stereotyped** characters.

tinny Having an unpleasantly metallic taste.

Tinny music played in the background.

tired Depleted of strength or energy.

A few boxes of **tired** vegetables.

Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse.

His remarks were **trite** and commonplace.

vapid Offering nothing that is stimulating or challenging; bland.

A **vapid** smile.

weak

Relating to or denoting the weakest of the known kinds of force between

particles which acts only at distances less than about 10 cm is very much weaker than the electromagnetic and the strong interactions and conserves

neither strangeness parity nor isospin.

The central government had grown too **weak** to impose order.

well worn Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.






Usage Examples of "Cheesy" as an adjective

Back and sides of a hog salted and dried or smoked; usually sliced thin and

bacon fried.

Crisp rashers of **bacon**.

baked Dried out by heat or excessive exposure to sunlight.

Land lying **baked** in the heat.

beef The substance of a matter.

He was **beef**ing about how the recession was killing the business.

bread Coat food with breadcrumbs before cooking.

His day job puts **bread** on the table.

A flat round cake of a savoury ingredient, typically minced beef.

burger He sometimes schedules business lunches at his favorite **burger** joint in

Manhattan.



cooked Having been prepared for eating by the application of heat.

A cooked breakfast.

A sweet of a specified flavour which is creamy in texture.

Skim **cream** from the surface of milk.

crispy (of food) having a firm, dry, and brittle surface or texture.

Crispy fried bacon.

deli A shop selling ready-to-eat food products.

garnish

Decorate (food), as with parsley or other ornamental foods.

Some flowers are edible and make attractive salad **garnish**.

grill Cook food using a grill.

The student was **grill**ed for two hours on the subject of phonology.

ham The back of the thigh or the thighs and buttocks.

Thin slices of **ham**.

hamburger A sandwich consisting of a fried cake of minced beef served on a bun, often

with other ingredients.

lasagna Baked dish of layers of lasagna pasta with sauce and cheese and meat or

vegetables.

The flesh of an animal, typically a mammal or bird, as food (the flesh of

meat domestic fowls is sometimes distinguished as poultry.

Meat pies.

milk Take milk from female mammals.

Cows need to be **milk**ed every morning.

Meat from a mature domestic sheep.

mutton

A leg of **mutton**.

A dish of Italian origin, consisting of a flat round base of dough baked with a

topping of tomatoes and cheese, typically with added meat, fish, or

pizza vegetables.

A pizza restaurant.

Gorge oneself with food.

porkWe **pork**ed out on cookies and pies.

roast Of food having been roasted.

Roast the turkey.

sandwich Relating to a sandwich course.

She was **sandwich**ed in her airplane seat between two fat men.

___ An object shaped like a sausage.

Her hair hung in glossy black **sausage** curls.



smoked (of glass) treated in such a way as to darken it.

A plate of **smoked** salmon.

spaghetti Spaghetti served with a tomato sauce.

steak A thick slice of steak or other high quality meat or fish.

Half a pound of fillet **steak**.

toaster An electrical device for making toast.

Excellent; best possible.

topping A cake with a marzipan topping.

veal The flesh of a young calf, used as food.

Veal and ham pie.

venison Meat from a deer.

Venison steaks.

A semi-solid food prepared from milk fermented by added bacteria, often

yogurt sweetened and flavoured.

Low fat **yogurt**.
