cook

Someone who cooks food.

*Susan was a school **cook**.*

cordon bleu cook

Cord or ribbon worn as an insignia of honor or rank.

food preparer

Anything that provides mental stimulus for thinking.



Associations of "Chef" (30 Words)

bake	A social gathering at which baked food of a specified kind is eaten. <i>Lobster bakes.</i>
baked	Intoxicated by drink or drugs, especially cannabis. <i>Land lying baked in the heat.</i>
bakery	Baked goods such as bread and cakes. <i>Bakery items.</i>
baste	Cover with liquid before cooking. <i>Slip herbs under the skin and baste the chicken constantly.</i>
<u>bread</u>	Coat food with breadcrumbs before cooking. <i>His day job puts bread on the table.</i>
broil	Cook under a broiler. <i>The sun broils the valley in the summer.</i>
<u>cafe</u>	A shop selling sweets, cigarettes, newspapers, etc. and staying open after normal hours.
cake	An item of soft sweet food made from a mixture of flour, fat, eggs, sugar, and other ingredients, baked and sometimes iced or decorated. <i>The blood under his nose was beginning to cake.</i>
<u>cook</u>	A person who prepares and cooks food especially as a job or in a specified way. <i>The band used to get up on the bandstand and really cook.</i>
cooked	Altered dishonestly; falsified. <i>As the result of cooked books stock prices soared.</i>
cookery	The act of preparing something (as food) by the application of heat. <i>Cookery writers.</i>
cooking	Suitable for or used in cooking. <i>Authentic Italian cooking.</i>
crispy	Tender and brittle. <i>Crispy fried bacon.</i>
crust	Form a crust or form into a crust. <i>A crust of snow.</i>
flour	Convert grain into flour. <i>Manioc flour.</i>
fried	Under the influence of alcohol or drugs. <i>Ronnie broke out a bottle of Scotch we all got pretty fried.</i>
goody	A good or favoured person, especially a hero in a book, film, etc.

grill	Cook over or under a grill. <i>He cooked hamburgers on the grill.</i>
johnnycake	Maize flour bread typically baked or fried on a griddle.
microwave	Cook food in a microwave oven. <i>He microwaved some steak out of the freezer.</i>
oven	A small furnace or kiln. <i>Bake the dish in a preheated oven.</i>
pan	An amount of something contained in a pan. <i>The critics panned the performance.</i>
paste	A paste used as an adhesive especially for sticking paper. <i>He pasted his opponent.</i>
pastry	An item of food consisting of sweet pastry with a cream jam or fruit filling. <i>Spread the mixture over the pastry.</i>
preparation	Something done to get ready for an event or undertaking. <i>A microscope preparation.</i>
<u>recipe</u>	A medical prescription. <i>It would be useless to enumerate all the drugs and recipes for their application which have been tried.</i>
roast	The process of roasting something especially coffee or the result of this. <i>Jessica could feel her face begin to roast.</i>
smoked	Dried and cured by hanging in wood smoke. <i>A plate of smoked salmon.</i>
tamp	A tool for tamping e.g. for tamping tobacco into a pipe bowl or a charge into a drill hole etc. <i>When the hole was tamped to the top gunpowder was inserted.</i>
toaster	A kitchen appliance (usually electric) for toasting bread.
