- Furniture with drawers for keeping clothes.
- The whole of a person's upper trunk, especially as considered with reference to their respiratory health or to their size of clothes.
- Box with a lid; used for storage; usually large and sturdy.
- The part of the human torso between the neck and the diaphragm or the corresponding part in other vertebrates.
- The front surface of a person's or animal's body between the neck and the stomach.
- A small cabinet for medicines, toiletries, etc.
