<b>chichi</b>	Someone who dresses in a trendy fashionable way.
<b>chicness</b>	Elegance by virtue of being fashionable.
<b>elegance</b>	The quality of being graceful and stylish in appearance or manner. <i>The simplicity and <b>elegance</b> of his invention.</i>
<b>finesse</b>	(in bridge and whist) an attempt to win a trick with a card that is not a certain winner, typically by playing it as the third card in a trick in the hope that any card that could beat it is in the hand of the opponent who has already played. <i>Orchestral playing of great <b>finesse</b>.</i>
<b>flair</b>	Stylishness and originality. <i>She had a <b>flair</b> for languages.</i>
<b>flourish</b>	An ornamental flowing curve in handwriting or scrollwork. <i>She entered with a great <b>flourish</b>.</i>
<b>grace</b>	In Greek mythology three beautiful goddesses Aglaia Thalia and Euphrosyne believed to personify and bestow charm grace and beauty. <i>The Virgin lived in a state of <b>grace</b>.</i>
<b>gracefulness</b>	Beautiful carriage.
<b>last word</b>	Holding device shaped like a human foot that is used to fashion or repair shoes.
<b>modishness</b>	Elegance by virtue of being fashionable.

<b>panache</b>	A tuft or plume of feathers, especially as a headdress or on a helmet. <i>He entertained London society with great <b>panache</b>.</i>
<b>poise</b>	Composure and dignity of manner. <i><b>Poise</b> and good deportment can be cultivated.</i>
<b>polish</b>	A preparation used in polishing. <i>They performed with great <b>polish</b>.</i>
<b><u>smartness</u></b>	A kind of pain such as that caused by a wound or a burn or a sore. <i>The <b>smartness</b> of the pace soon exhausted him.</i>
<b>sophistication</b>	The quality or character of being intellectually sophisticated and worldly through cultivation or experience or disillusionment. <i>The technological <b>sophistication</b> of their products.</i>
<b>stylishness</b>	Elegance by virtue of being fashionable.
<b>suaveness</b>	The quality of being bland and gracious or ingratiating in manner.
<b>swank</b>	Elegance by virtue of being fashionable. <i>A little money will buy you a good deal of <b>swank</b>.</i>
<b>taste</b>	A kind of sensing distinguishing substances by means of the taste buds. <i>Have you lost your <b>taste</b> for fancy restaurants.</i>
<b>urbanity</b>	Polished courtesy; elegance of manner. <i>A picture of banal <b>urbanity</b>.</i>

<b>attractive</b>	Having power to arouse interest. <i>A stunningly <b>attractive</b> charismatic man.</i>
<b>dapper</b>	Neat and trim in dress and appearance (typically used of a man). <i>A <b>dapper</b> young man.</i>
<b>dashing</b>	Lively and spirited. <i>A <b>dashing</b> black fedora.</i>
<b>debonair</b>	Having a sophisticated charm. <i>A <b>debonair</b> gentleman.</i>
<b>elegant</b>	Refined and tasteful in appearance or behavior or style. <i>Small churches with <b>elegant</b> white spires.</i>
<b>flattering</b>	Enhancing someone's appearance. <i>It was <b>flattering</b> to have a pretty girl like Fiona so obviously fond of him.</i>

<b>smart</b>	Showing mental alertness and calculation and resourcefulness. <i><b>Smart</b> weapons.</i>
<b><u>sophisticated</u></b>	Appealing to or frequented by people who are sophisticated. <i>A young man with <b>sophisticated</b> tastes.</i>
<b><u>stylish</u></b>	Neat, confident, and skilful. <i>A <b>stylish</b> cocktail bar.</i>
<b><u>tasteful</u></b>	Free from what is tawdry or unbecoming. <i>A <b>tasteful</b> lounge bar.</i>
<b>trim</b>	Slim and fit. <i>A <b>trim</b> little villa.</i>
<b><u>understated</u></b>	Exhibiting restrained good taste. <i><b>Understated</b> elegance.</i>
<b>voguish</b>	Popular or in fashion at a particular time. <i>Mermaid chic is very <b>voguish</b> this season.</i>

<b>abreast</b>	Being up to particular standard or level especially in being up to date in knowledge. <i>The path was wide enough for two people to walk <b>abreast</b>.</i>
<b>alongside</b>	Side by side.
<b>attractive</b>	Pleasing to the eye or mind especially through beauty or charm. <i>An <b>attractive</b> force.</i>
<b>coquettish</b>	Like a coquette. <i>A <b>coquettish</b> grin.</i>
<b>craze</b>	A fine crack in a glaze or other surface. <i><b>Crazed</b> by hunger the population began to turn on the rebels.</i>

<b>dapper</b>	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>A <b>dapper</b> young man.</i>

<b>fashion</b>	The production and marketing of new styles of clothing and cosmetics. <i>The skins were <b>fashioned</b> into boots and shoes.</i>
<b>fashionable</b>	Popular and considered appealing or fashionable at the time. <i>A <b>fashionable</b> cafe.</i>
<b>glamorous</b>	(of a person) having a beauty or charm that is sexually attractive. <i><b>Glamorous</b> movie stars.</i>
<b>jaunty</b>	Having a cheerful, lively, and self-confident air. <i>A <b>jaunty</b> red hat.</i>
<b>lately</b>	In the recent past. <i><b>Lately</b> the rules have been enforced.</i>
<b>latest</b>	In the current fashion or style. <i>The very <b>latest</b> scientific discoveries.</i>
<b>modern</b>	Belonging to the modern era since the Middle Ages. <i>Totem poles are <b>modern</b> rather than prehistoric.</i>
<b>modish</b>	Conforming to or following what is currently popular and fashionable. <i>It seems sad that such a scholar should feel compelled to use this <b>modish</b> jargon.</i>
<b>natty</b>	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>A <b>natty</b> blue blazer.</i>
<b>newfangled</b>	Gratuitously new. <i>I ve no time for such <b>newfangled</b> nonsense.</i>
<b>presently</b>	At this time or period; now. <i>He is <b>presently</b> our ambassador to the United Nations.</i>
<b>raffish</b>	Unconventional and slightly disreputable, especially in an attractive way. <i>A cocktail party given by some <b>raffish</b> bachelors.</i>
<b>rakish</b>	Having or displaying a dashing, jaunty, or slightly disreputable quality or appearance. <i>He had a <b>rakish</b> debonair look.</i>
<b>recency</b>	The property of having happened or appeared not long ago.
<b>recent</b>	Of the immediate past or just previous to the present time. <i>His <b>recent</b> visit to Britain.</i>



<b>recently</b>	In the recent past. <i>Until <b>recently</b> we had a female doctor.</i>
<b><u>seductive</u></b>	Tending to entice into a desired action or state. <i>A <b>seductive</b> voice.</i>
<b><u>stylish</u></b>	Being or in accordance with current social fashions. <i>A <b>stylish</b> range of jewellery.</i>
<b><u>tempting</u></b>	Very pleasantly inviting. <i>A <b>tempting</b> financial offer.</i>
<b>unconventional</b>	Not conventional or conformist. <i>An <b>unconventional</b> marriage.</i>
<b>up-to-date</b>	A participant in a date.
<b>urbanity</b>	Polished courtesy; elegance of manner. <i>There is an important difference between rusticity and <b>urbanity</b>.</i>
