in the main To or toward the inside of.



mainly More than anything else.

mostly As regards the greater part or number.

Uniquely or characteristically.

A **particularly** gruesome attack.

predominantly

Much greater in number or influence.

Predominantly Russian areas.

primarily For the most part; mainly.

This is **primarily** a question of economics.

principally For the most part.

He was **principally** a landscape painter.

substantiallyFor the most part; essentially.

Profits grew substantially.

essentially or thing.

exceptionally

To a greater degree than normal; unusually.

The weather was **exceptionally** mild for the time of the year.

generally Usually; as a rule.

A decade when France was moving **generally** to the left.

habitually By way of habit; customarily.

He **habitually** carried a pocket knife.

irresistibly

In a way that is too powerful or convincing to be resisted.

I am **irresistibly** reminded of the advice of a friend of mine.

largely

In large part; mainly or chiefly.

He was soon arrested **largely** through the efforts of Tom Poole.

mainly For the most part.

He is **mainly** interested in butterflies.

mostly In large part; mainly or chiefly.

The culprits are **mostly** but not exclusively male.

norm Adjust something to conform to a norm.

Strikes were the **norm**.

normally Under normal or usual conditions; as a rule.

Try to breathe **normally**.

In an original manner.

overwhelmingly To a very great degree or with a great majority.
