<b><u>naive</u></b>	Of or created by one without formal training simple or naive in style. <i>This <b>naive</b> simple creature with wide friendly eyes so eager to believe appearances.</i>
<b>round-eyed</b>	Having large round wide-open eyes.
<b>simple</b>	(of interest) payable on the sum loaned only. <i>A quiet unassuming man with <b>simple</b> tastes.</i>
<b>trustful</b>	Having or marked by a total belief in the reliability, truth, or ability of someone. <i>A <b>trustful</b> acceptance of authority.</i>
<b>trusting</b>	Inclined to believe or confide readily; full of trust. <i>A shy and <b>trusting</b> child.</i>
<b>unguarded</b>	Not well considered; careless. <i>An <b>unguarded</b> gate.</i>
<b><u>unsophisticated</u></b>	Not wise in the ways of the world. <i>The nightlife of Montmartre awed the <b>unsophisticated</b> tourists.</i>
<b>unsuspicious</b>	Not suspicious. <i>She has a caring <b>unsuspicious</b> nature.</i>
<b>unwary</b>	Not alert to danger or deception- O.J.Campbell. <i>Accidents can happen to the <b>unwary</b> traveller.</i>
<b>unworldly</b>	Not seeming to belong to this planet; strange. <i>Was <b>unworldly</b> and did not greatly miss worldly rewards.</i>
<b>wide-eyed</b>	Fully open or extended.

<b>credulous</b>	Disposed to believe on little evidence. <i>A ceremony staged for <b>credulous</b> tourists.</i>
<b>downright</b>	To an extreme degree; thoroughly. <i>A <b>downright</b> lie.</i>
<b>easily</b>	With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily. <i>The body could <b>easily</b> be that of an actress.</i>
<b>frank</b>	Clearly manifest; evident. <i><b>Frank</b> ulceration.</i>
<b>girl</b>	A person's girlfriend. <i>I had to look my best for my <b>girl</b>.</i>
<b>guileless</b>	Devoid of guile; innocent and without deception. <i>His face once so open and <b>guileless</b>.</i>
<b>honest</b>	Worthy of being depended on. <i>He'd made an <b>honest</b> mistake.</i>
<b>honesty</b>	The quality of being honest. <i>I bought potatoes and tomatoes from the roadside stall putting 3 in the <b>honesty</b> box.</i>
<b>immature</b>	Not fully developed. <i><b>Immature</b> behavior.</i>
<b>impressionable</b>	Easily influenced. <i>An <b>impressionable</b> age.</i>
<b>inexperienced</b>	Lacking practical experience or training. <i>An <b>inexperienced</b> driver.</i>
<b>infantile</b>	Of or relating to infants or infancy. <i><b>Infantile</b> colic.</i>
<b>ingenu</b>	An artless innocent young girl (especially as portrayed on the stage).
<b>ingenuous</b>	Characterized by an inability to mask your feelings; not devious. <i>She's staggeringly <b>ingenuous</b> or possibly very cunning indeed.</i>
<b>innocence</b>	The state, quality, or fact of being innocent of a crime or offence. <i>All the boys lost their <b>innocence</b> with her.</i>

<b>naivete</b>	Lack of sophistication or worldliness. <i>Some of the material is laughable in its naivet.</i>
<b>out-and-out</b>	Moving or appearing to move away from a place, especially one that is enclosed or hidden.
<b>puerile</b>	Of or characteristic of a child. <b><i>Puerile</i></b> jokes.
<b><u>sincere</u></b>	Open and genuine; not deceitful. <i>He was a good man decent and <b>sincere</b>.</i>
<b>suggestible</b>	Open to suggestion; easily swayed. <b><i>Suggestible</i></b> young minds.
<b>trusting</b>	Inclined to believe or confide readily; full of trust. <i>It is foolish to be too <b>trusting</b> of other people.</i>
<b><u>unsophisticated</u></b>	Awkwardly simple and provincial. <i>Either too <b>unsophisticated</b> or too honest to promise more than he could deliver.</i>
<b>yokel</b>	An uneducated and unsophisticated person from the countryside.
