A contrived or fantastic idea.

<b>illusion</b>	An erroneous mental representation. <i>Stripes embellish the surface to create the <b>illusion</b> of various wood grain textures.</i>
<b>mirage</b>	An unrealistic hope or wish that cannot be achieved. <i>The hope of sanctuary initially proved a <b>mirage</b>.</i>
<b>phantom</b>	Something existing in perception only. <i>A <b>phantom</b> conspiracy.</i>
<b>will-o'-the-wisp</b>	An illusion that misleads.

<b>beast</b>	A person's brutish or untamed characteristics. <i>The gift of reason differentiates humanity from the <b>beasts</b>.</i>
<b>brutish</b>	Resembling a beast; showing lack of human sensibility. <i><b>Brutish</b> behaviour.</i>
<b>carnivore</b>	A terrestrial or aquatic flesh-eating mammal. <i>Tyrannosaurus Rex was a large <b>carnivore</b>.</i>

<b>demon</b>	Reckless mischief; devilry. <i>He worked like a <b>demon</b> to finish the job on time.</i>
<b>devil</b>	A person with specified characteristics. <i>He was dangerous when the <b>devil</b> was in him.</i>
<b>dragon</b>	A mythical monster like a giant reptile In European tradition the dragon is typically fire breathing and tends to symbolize chaos or evil whereas in East Asia it is usually a beneficent symbol of fertility associated with water and the heavens. <i>The geography teacher was a real <b>dragon</b>.</i>
<b>dryad</b>	A deity or nymph of the woods.
<b>evil</b>	Of a force or spirit embodying or associated with the forces of the devil. <i>His struggle against the forces of <b>evil</b>.</i>
<b>fairy</b>	Offensive term for a homosexual man. <i><b>Fairy</b> gold.</i>
<b>faun</b>	One of a class of lustful rural gods, represented as a man with a goat's horns, ears, legs, and tail.
<b>fauna</b>	All the animal life in a particular region or period. <i>The flora and <b>fauna</b> of Siberia.</i>
<b>hydra</b>	A minute freshwater coelenterate with a tubular body and a ring of tentacles around the mouth. <i>We may be facing a <b>hydra</b> that defies any easy solution.</i>
<b>imagine</b>	Expect, believe, or suppose. <i>I couldn't <b>imagine</b> what she expected to tell them.</i>
<b>inhumane</b>	Without compassion for misery or suffering; cruel. <i>Humans are innately <b>inhumane</b> this explains much of the misery and suffering in the world.</i>
<b>mammalian</b>	Relating to or denoting a mammal. <i>Cats and other <b>mammalian</b> predators.</i>
<b>marauder</b>	Someone who attacks in search of booty. <i>A band of English <b>marauders</b> were surprised and overcome.</i>
<b>monster</b>	Criticize or reprimand severely. <i>A <b>monster</b> with the head of a hyena and hindquarters of a wolf.</i>
<b>myth</b>	An exaggerated or idealized conception of a person or thing. <i>Ancient Celtic <b>myths</b>.</i>
<b>mythical</b>	Occurring in or characteristic of myths or folk tales. <i>A <b>mythical</b> customer whose name appears in brochures promoting the bank's services.</i>

- mythological** Relating to, based on, or appearing in myths or mythology.  
*The tree of life is one of the oldest of all **mythological** symbols.*
- phoenix** A legendary Arabian bird said to periodically burn itself to death and emerge from the ashes as a new phoenix according to most versions only one phoenix lived at a time and it renewed itself every 500 years.  
*I m that **phoenix** the old fashioned family doctor.*
- picaresque** Relating to an episodic style of fiction dealing with the adventures of a rough and dishonest but appealing hero.  
*A **picaresque** adventure novel.*
- predator** Any animal that lives by preying on other animals.  
*A defensive move to prevent the business falling into the hands of an overseas **predator**.*
- satyr** A satyrid butterfly with chiefly dark brown wings.  
*Charles was an unmarried **satyr**.*
- tale** A trivial lie.  
*She enjoyed hearing others tell their **tales**.*
- unicorn** A heraldic representation of a unicorn with a twisted horn a deer s feet a goat s beard and a lion s tail.  
*An album like this is something of a **unicorn**.*
