
Chisel as a Verb

chip Form by chipping.

fashion Make out of components (often in an improvising manner.

The bottles were **fashion**ed from green glass.



fleece Cover as if with a fleece.

The sky was half blue half **fleece**d with white clouds.

form Bring or be brought into a certain formation.

A thick mist was **form**ing all around.

gull Make a fool or dupe of.

hammer Hit or beat something repeatedly with a hammer or similar object.

He got **hammer**ed for an honest mistake.

model Work as a model by displaying clothes or posing for an artist or sculptor.

Model an airplane.

rip off Cut (wood) along the grain.

rough-hew Hew roughly, without finishing the surface.

sculpt Create by shaping stone or wood or any other hard material.

She is **sculpt**ing the block of marble into an image of her husband.

sculpture Form or shape as if by sculpture especially with strong smooth curves.

The choir stalls were each carefully **sculpture**d.

Shape Give shape or form to.

Shape a figure.


swindle Obtain (money) fraudulently.

He **swindle**d me out of my inheritance.

whittle Carve (an object) from wood.

A set of chess pieces he had **whittle**d himself.





Usage Examples of "Chisel" as a verb

- Chisel the marble.
- ullet Chisel a hole through the brickwork.
