### Definitions of "Chisel" as a verb

- *Engage in deceitful behavior; practice trickery or fraud.*
- *Cheat or swindle (someone) out of something.*
- *Cut or shape (something) with a chisel.*
- *Carve with a chisel.*
- *Deprive somebody of something by deceit.*



## Synonyms of "Chisel" as a verb (18 Words)

- carve** Cut (a slice of meat) from a larger piece.  
*The wood was **carved** with runes.*
- cheat** Gain an advantage over or deprive of something by using unfair or deceitful methods; defraud.  
*I wish someone had told me my partner was **cheating** on me.*
- chip** Form by chipping.  
*The paint had **chipped** off the gate.*
- cut** Cut and assemble the components of.  
***Cut** a nice figure.*
- defraud** Illegally obtain money from (someone) by deception.  
*She **defrauded** the customers who trusted her.*
- fashion** Make out of components (often in an improvising manner).  
*The bottles were **fashioned** from green glass.*

<b>fleece</b>	Cover as if with a fleece. <i>The sky was half blue half <b>fleeced</b> with white clouds.</i>
<b>form</b>	Bring or be brought into a certain formation. <i>A thick mist was <b>forming</b> all around.</i>
<b>gull</b>	Make a fool or dupe of.
<b>hammer</b>	Hit or beat something repeatedly with a hammer or similar object. <i>He got <b>hammered</b> for an honest mistake.</i>
<b>model</b>	Work as a model by displaying clothes or posing for an artist or sculptor. <i><b>Model</b> an airplane.</i>
<b>rip off</b>	Cut (wood) along the grain.
<b>rough-hew</b>	Hew roughly, without finishing the surface.
<b>sculpt</b>	Create by shaping stone or wood or any other hard material. <i>She is <b>sculpting</b> the block of marble into an image of her husband.</i>
<b><u>sculpture</u></b>	Form or shape as if by sculpture especially with strong smooth curves. <i>The choir stalls were each carefully <b>sculptured</b>.</i>
<b><u>shape</u></b>	Give shape or form to. <i><b>Shape</b> a figure.</i>
<b>swindle</b>	Obtain (money) fraudulently. <i>He <b>swindled</b> me out of my inheritance.</i>
<b>whittle</b>	Carve (an object) from wood. <i>A set of chess pieces he had <b>whittled</b> himself.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Chisel" as a verb

- *They chiseled me out of my money.*
- *He's chiselled me out of my dues.*
- *Chisel the marble.*
- *Chisel a hole through the brickwork.*
- *Who's chiseling on the side?*



## Associations of "Chisel" (30 Words)

- anvil** A heavy iron block with a flat top and concave sides, on which metal can be hammered and shaped.  
*Anvil clouds.*
- ax** Chop or split with an ax.  
*Axe wood.*
- axe** Cut or strike with an axe especially violently or destructively.  
*The Chancellor warned the cabinet to **axe** public spending.*
- behead** Cut off the head of (someone), especially as a form of execution.  
*Mary was **beheaded** at Fotheringhay.*
- blade** A cutting or thrusting weapon that has a long metal blade and a hilt with a hand guard.  
*Gay young **blades** bragged of their amorous adventures.*

<b>carve</b>	Cut (a hard material) in order to produce an object, design, or inscription. <i>I <b>carved</b> my initials on the tree.</i>
<b>cleaver</b>	A butcher's knife having a large square blade. <i>A meat <b>cleaver</b>.</i>
<b>cut</b>	A piece of meat cut from a carcass. <i>We <b>cut</b> through the neighbor s yard to get home sooner.</i>
<b>delude</b>	Be false to; be dishonest with. <i>Too many theorists have <b>deluded</b> the public.</i>
<b>engrave</b>	Cut or carve a text or design on (a hard object). <i>His drawings of public buildings were <b>engraved</b> by Edward Rooker.</i>
<b>equipment</b>	The process of supplying someone or something with necessary equipment. <i>The construction and <b>equipment</b> of new harbour facilities.</i>
<b>gadget</b>	A device or control that is very useful for a particular job. <i>A variety of kitchen <b>gadgets</b>.</i>
<b>gizmo</b>	A gadget, especially one whose name the speaker does not know or cannot recall. <i>The latest multimedia <b>gizmo</b>.</i>
<b>hammer</b>	The sport of throwing a hammer. <i>She <b>hammered</b> on his door.</i>
<b>hatchet</b>	A small axe with a short handle for use in one hand.
<b>kitchen</b>	A set of fitments and units that are sold together and fixed in place in a kitchen. <i><b>Kitchen</b> Swahili.</i>
<b>knife</b>	Cut or move cleanly through something with a knife like action. <i>The victim was <b>knifed</b> to death.</i>
<b>mallet</b>	A long-handled wooden stick with a head like a hammer, used for hitting a croquet or polo ball.
<b>scraper</b>	A tool or device used for scraping, especially for removing dirt, paint, or other unwanted matter from a surface. <i>Residues should be removed with sharp <b>scrapers</b>.</i>
<b>shovel</b>	The quantity a shovel can hold. <i>She <b>shovelled</b> coal on the fire.</i>
<b>sickle</b>	An edge tool for cutting grass or crops; has a curved blade and a short handle.
<b>silversmith</b>	Someone who makes or repairs articles of silver.
<b>sledge</b>	Beat with a sledgehammer. <i>A <b>sledge</b> journey.</i>

<b>smith</b>	Rhodesian statesman who declared independence of Zimbabwe from Great Britain (born in 1919). <i>We do not know whether the metals were mined and smelted by the <b>smith</b> or purchased from miners.</i>
<b>tannery</b>	Workplace where skins and hides are tanned.
<b>tool</b>	A small stamp or roller used to make a tooled design. <i>Gardening <b>tools</b>.</i>
<b>trowel</b>	Use a trowel on for light garden work or plaster work. <i>Kerrie <b>trowelled</b> jam on to her toast.</i>
<b>widget</b>	(in some beer cans) a plastic device which introduces nitrogen into the beer, giving it a creamy head.
<b><u>wooden</u></b>	Like or characteristic of wood. <i>She closed the heavy <b>wooden</b> door.</i>
