Associations of "Choked up" (30 Words)

ascend	(of a voice or sound) rise in pitch. <i>The mountaineers slowly ascended the steep slope.</i>
ascending	Increasing in size or importance. <i>The ascending stems of chickweed.</i>
ascent	A rise to a higher social or professional rank. <i>The first ascent of the Matterhorn.</i>
boost	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>The cut in interest rates will give a further boost to the economy.</i>
<u>climb</u>	An ascent especially of a mountain or hill by climbing. <i>The path climbed all the way to the top of the hill.</i>
<u>climbing</u>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>His other great interest was climbing especially in the Alps.</i>
<u>elevate</u>	(of a priest) hold up (a consecrated host or chalice) for adoration. <i>The field guns were elevated twenty degrees.</i>
elevator	A muscle whose contraction raises a part of the body. <i>In the elevator she pressed the button for the lobby.</i>
escalator	A moving staircase consisting of an endlessly circulating belt of steps driven by a motor, which conveys people between the floors of a public building.
<u>hoist</u>	Move from one place to another by lifting. <i>A white flag was hoisted.</i>
ladder	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>He climbed the career ladder.</i>
lift	Lifting device consisting of a platform or cage that is raised and lowered mechanically in a vertical shaft in order to move people from one floor to another in a building. <i>The lift door opened.</i>

mounting	The action of mounting something. <i>The mounting of rapid fire guns.</i>
muffle	Conceal or hide. <i>Muffle one's anger.</i>
neck	The length of a horse's head and neck as a measure of its lead in a race. <i>The neck of the womb usually called the cervix.</i>
precipitate	A precipitated solid substance in suspension or after settling or filtering. <i>The crisis precipitated by Russia's revolution.</i>
raise	Multiply a number by itself a specified number of times 8 is 2 raised to the power 3. <i>Raise Cain.</i>
rise	The property possessed by a slope or surface that rises. <i>I gained the crest of a rise and saw the plain stretched out before me.</i>
risen	Above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i>
rising	Advancing to maturity or high standing. <i>The rising generation.</i>
smother	A mass of something that stifles or obscures. <i>All this vanished in a smother of foam.</i>
soar	Fly a plane without an engine. <i>When she heard his voice her spirits soared.</i>
stairs	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
stepladder	A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.
stifle	Be asphyxiated; die from lack of oxygen. <i>She stifled a giggle.</i>
throttle	A pedal that controls the throttle valve. <i>The pitch of the engine fell as the driver throttled back.</i>
uphill	Sloping upward. <i>An uphill struggle to gain worldwide recognition.</i>
upstairs	An upper floor. <i>No one was allowed to see the upstairs.</i>
upward	Spatially or metaphorically from a lower to a higher position. <i>Upwardly mobile.</i>
zoom	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>You can enlarge a region of the screen by zooming in.</i>
