## Associations of "Choked up" (30 Words)

<b>ascend</b>	(of a voice or sound) rise in pitch. <i>The mountaineers slowly <b>ascended</b> the steep slope.</i>
<b>ascending</b>	Increasing in size or importance. <i>The <b>ascending</b> stems of chickweed.</i>
<b>ascent</b>	A rise to a higher social or professional rank. <i>The first <b>ascent</b> of the Matterhorn.</i>
<b>boost</b>	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>The cut in interest rates will give a further <b>boost</b> to the economy.</i>
<b><u>climb</u></b>	An ascent especially of a mountain or hill by climbing. <i>The path <b>climbed</b> all the way to the top of the hill.</i>
<b><u>climbing</u></b>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>His other great interest was <b>climbing</b> especially in the Alps.</i>
<b><u>elevate</u></b>	(of a priest) hold up (a consecrated host or chalice) for adoration. <i>The field guns were <b>elevated</b> twenty degrees.</i>
<b>elevator</b>	A muscle whose contraction raises a part of the body. <i>In the <b>elevator</b> she pressed the button for the lobby.</i>
<b>escalator</b>	A moving staircase consisting of an endlessly circulating belt of steps driven by a motor, which conveys people between the floors of a public building.
<b><u>hoist</u></b>	Move from one place to another by lifting. <i>A white flag was <b>hoisted</b>.</i>
<b>ladder</b>	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>He climbed the career <b>ladder</b>.</i>
<b>lift</b>	Lifting device consisting of a platform or cage that is raised and lowered mechanically in a vertical shaft in order to move people from one floor to another in a building. <i>The <b>lift</b> door opened.</i>

<b>mounting</b>	The action of mounting something. <i>The <b>mounting</b> of rapid fire guns.</i>
<b>muffle</b>	Conceal or hide. <i><b>Muffle</b> one's anger.</i>
<b>neck</b>	The length of a horse's head and neck as a measure of its lead in a race. <i>The <b>neck</b> of the womb usually called the cervix.</i>
<b>precipitate</b>	A precipitated solid substance in suspension or after settling or filtering. <i>The crisis <b>precipitated</b> by Russia's revolution.</i>
<b>raise</b>	Multiply a number by itself a specified number of times 8 is 2 raised to the power 3. <i><b>Raise</b> Cain.</i>
<b>rise</b>	The property possessed by a slope or surface that rises. <i>I gained the crest of a <b>rise</b> and saw the plain stretched out before me.</i>
<b>risen</b>	Above the horizon. <i>The <b>risen</b> sun.</i>
<b>rising</b>	Advancing to maturity or high standing. <i>The <b>rising</b> generation.</i>
<b>smother</b>	A mass of something that stifles or obscures. <i>All this vanished in a <b>smother</b> of foam.</i>
<b>soar</b>	Fly a plane without an engine. <i>When she heard his voice her spirits <b>soared</b>.</i>
<b>stairs</b>	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
<b>stepladder</b>	A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.
<b>stifle</b>	Be asphyxiated; die from lack of oxygen. <i>She <b>stifled</b> a giggle.</i>
<b>throttle</b>	A pedal that controls the throttle valve. <i>The pitch of the engine fell as the driver <b>throttled</b> back.</i>
<b>uphill</b>	Sloping upward. <i>An <b>uphill</b> struggle to gain worldwide recognition.</i>
<b>upstairs</b>	An upper floor. <i>No one was allowed to see the <b>upstairs</b>.</i>
<b>upward</b>	Spatially or metaphorically from a lower to a higher position. <i><b>Upwardly</b> mobile.</i>
<b>zoom</b>	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>You can enlarge a region of the screen by <b>zooming</b> in.</i>
