- ax** Chop or split with an ax.
*The NSF **axed** the research program and stopped funding it.*
- axe** Cut or strike with an axe especially violently or destructively.
*Thirty staff are facing the **axe** at the Royal Infirmary.*
- bacon** English scientist and Franciscan monk who stressed the importance of experimentation; first showed that air is required for combustion and first used lenses to correct vision (1220-1292).
*Crisp rashers of **bacon**.*
- beef** Meat from an adult domestic bovine.
*He was brought in to give the team more **beef**.*
- behead** Cut the head of.
*Mary was **beheaded** at Fotheringhay.*

drudgery	Hard menial or dull work. <i>Domestic drudgery.</i>
finely	Made or consisting of small particles or threads. <i>A finely worked tapestry.</i>
garlic	Used in names of plants with a similar smell or flavour to garlic e.g wild garlic. <i>Garlic butter.</i>
grind	Created by grinding. <i>Relief from the daily grind.</i>
hack	Cut with a hacking tool. <i>Men hack at the coalface.</i>
ham	The back of the thigh or the thighs and buttocks. <i>Thin slices of ham.</i>
hammer	The sport of throwing a hammer. <i>They hammered St Mirren 4 0.</i>
hew	Make or shape as with an axe. <i>He had hewn down the famous elm tree.</i>
hone	Sharpen with a hone. <i>Hone a knife.</i>
knife	Stab someone with a knife. <i>He was knifed to death during the argument.</i>
mash	A mixture of mashed malt grains and hot water used in brewing. <i>The worst thing you can do is mash the brake pedal.</i>
meat	The edible part of fruits, nuts, or eggs. <i>He did the meat of the climb on the first day.</i>
mill	Grind something in a mill. <i>Ordinary wool blankets are made by milling a woven wool fabric.</i>
mince	Minced meat especially beef. <i>She minced down the street.</i>
pepper	Pungent seasoning from the berry of the common pepper plant of East India use whole or ground. <i>His car was peppered with bullets.</i>
pork	Meat from a domestic hog or pig. <i>Pork chops.</i>
powder	Apply powder to. <i>She dropped a powder into his water glass.</i>
pulverize	Destroy completely. <i>He had a winning car and pulverized the opposition.</i>

- roast** A piece of meat roasted or for roasting and of a size for slicing into more than one portion.
*Harold put on a terrific pig **roast**.*
- sausage** An object shaped like a sausage.
*Smoked German **sausage**.*
- sharpen** Make or become sharp or sharper.
*Her tone **sharpened**.*
- shred** Tear or cut into shreds.
*He really can **shred** that guitar.*
- shredded** Prepared by cutting.
***Shredded** paper.*
- steak** A thick slice of steak or other high quality meat or fish.
***Steak and kidney pie**.*
- tamp** A tool for tamping e g for tamping tobacco into a pipe bowl or a charge into a drill hole etc.
***Tamp** the coffee grinds in the container to make espresso.*
