- Rough with small waves.
- (of a sea, lake, or river) having many small waves.

heaving (of a place) extremely crowded.

Large and powerful especially designed for heavy loads or rough work.

He had a hig moustache and heavy features.

He had a big moustache and heavy features.

jarringIncongruous in a striking or shocking way; clashing.

The telephone struck a **jarring** note in those Renaissance surroundings.

Marked by abrupt transitions.

jerkyHe makes mischief with his **jerky** pals.

jolting Causing or characterized by jolts and irregular movements.jolty Causing or characterized by jolts and irregular movements.



jouncy Moving in a jolting or bouncy manner.

A **jouncy** 10 hour bus ride.

jumpy (of a person) anxious and uneasy.

A **jumpy** pulse.

rough Unkind or cruel or uncivil.

Rough carpentry.

squally Characterized by brief periods of violent wind or rain.

A grey **squally** morning.

storm-tossed Pounded or hit repeatedly by storms or adversities.

stormy Full of angry or violent outbursts of feeling.

A dark and **stormy** night.

tempestuous Characterized by strong and turbulent or conflicting emotion.

A tempestuous wind.


Agitated vigorously; in a state of turbulence.

uncomfortable Causing or feeling slight pain or physical discomfort.

The **uncomfortable** truth.
