## Choppy as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Choppy" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “choppy” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Marked by abrupt transitions.*
- *Having a disjointed or jerky quality.*
- *Denoting or relating to a hairstyle in which layers and sections of hair are cut at different lengths.*
- *Rough with small waves.*
- *(of a sea, lake, or river) having many small waves.*



## Synonyms of "Choppy" as an adjective (17 Words)

<b>bouncy</b>	Elastic; rebounds readily. <i><b>Bouncy</b> tunes.</i>
<b>full of waves</b>	Containing as much or as many as is possible or normal.
<b>heaving</b>	(of a place) extremely crowded. <i>The foyer was absolutely <b>heaving</b> with people.</i>
<b>heavy</b>	Large and powerful especially designed for heavy loads or rough work. <i>He had a big moustache and <b>heavy</b> features.</i>
<b>jarring</b>	Incongruous in a striking or shocking way; clashing. <i>The telephone struck a <b>jarring</b> note in those Renaissance surroundings.</i>
<b>jerky</b>	Marked by abrupt transitions. <i>He makes mischief with his <b>jerky</b> pals.</i>
<b>jolting</b>	Causing or characterized by jolts and irregular movements.
<b>jolty</b>	Causing or characterized by jolts and irregular movements.

<b>jouncy</b>	Moving in a jolting or bouncy manner. <i>A <b>jouncy</b> 10 hour bus ride.</i>
<b>jumpy</b>	(of a person) anxious and uneasy. <i>A <b>jumpy</b> pulse.</i>
<b>rough</b>	Unkind or cruel or uncivil. <i><b>Rough</b> carpentry.</i>
<b>squally</b>	Characterized by brief periods of violent wind or rain. <i>A grey <b>squally</b> morning.</i>
<b>storm-tossed</b>	Pounded or hit repeatedly by storms or adversities.
<b>stormy</b>	Full of angry or violent outbursts of feeling. <i>A dark and <b>stormy</b> night.</i>
<b>tempestuous</b>	Characterized by strong and turbulent or conflicting emotion. <i>A <b>tempestuous</b> wind.</i>
<u><b>turbulent</b></u>	Agitated vigorously; in a state of turbulence. <i>A <b>turbulent</b> and unruly childhood.</i>
<u><b>uncomfortable</b></u>	Causing or feeling slight pain or physical discomfort. <i>The <b>uncomfortable</b> truth.</i>
