Definitions of "Choppy" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “choppy” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Marked by abrupt transitions.*
- *Having a disjointed or jerky quality.*
- *Denoting or relating to a hairstyle in which layers and sections of hair are cut at different lengths.*
- *Rough with small waves.*
- *(of a sea, lake, or river) having many small waves.*



Synonyms of "Choppy" as an adjective (17 Words)

bouncy	Elastic; rebounds readily. <i>Bouncy tunes.</i>
full of waves	Containing as much or as many as is possible or normal.
heaving	(of a place) extremely crowded. <i>The foyer was absolutely heaving with people.</i>
heavy	Large and powerful especially designed for heavy loads or rough work. <i>He had a big moustache and heavy features.</i>
jarring	Incongruous in a striking or shocking way; clashing. <i>The telephone struck a jarring note in those Renaissance surroundings.</i>
jerky	Marked by abrupt transitions. <i>He makes mischief with his jerky pals.</i>
jolting	Causing or characterized by jolts and irregular movements.
jolty	Causing or characterized by jolts and irregular movements.

jouncy	Moving in a jolting or bouncy manner. <i>A jouncy 10 hour bus ride.</i>
jumpy	(of a person) anxious and uneasy. <i>A jumpy pulse.</i>
rough	Unkind or cruel or uncivil. <i>Rough carpentry.</i>
squally	Characterized by brief periods of violent wind or rain. <i>A grey squally morning.</i>
storm-tossed	Pounded or hit repeatedly by storms or adversities.
stormy	Full of angry or violent outbursts of feeling. <i>A dark and stormy night.</i>
tempestuous	Characterized by strong and turbulent or conflicting emotion. <i>A tempestuous wind.</i>
<u>turbulent</u>	Agitated vigorously; in a state of turbulence. <i>A turbulent and unruly childhood.</i>
<u>uncomfortable</u>	Causing or feeling slight pain or physical discomfort. <i>The uncomfortable truth.</i>
