- A specific piece of work required to be done as a duty or for a specific fee.






Synonyms of "Chore" as a noun (6 Words)

<u>burden</u>	An onerous or difficult concern. The burden of responsibility.
duty	(of a visit or other undertaking) done from a sense of moral obligation rather than for pleasure. A duty nurse.
errand	The purpose or object of an errand. She asked Tim to run an errand for her.
job	A workplace as in the expression on the job. The gang pulled off a bank job in St Louis.
task	A piece of work to be done or undertaken. The endless task of classifying the samples.
thing to be done	A persistent illogical feeling of desire or aversion.





Usage Examples of "Chore" as a noun

- The farmer's morning chores.
- The early risers were up and about, doing their chores.
- He sees interviews as a chore.





Associations of "Chore" (30 Words)

buyout	Acquisition of a company by purchasing a controlling percentage of its stock.
<u>clientele</u>	The customers of a shop, bar, or place of entertainment. <i>The solicitor s clientele</i> .
contracted	Reduced in size or pulled together. The contracted pupils of her eyes.
employed	(of a person) having a paid job. Most of our graduates are employed .
employee	A person employed for wages or salary, especially at non-executive level.
enterprise	A project or undertaking, especially a bold or complex one. A state owned enterprise .
errand	The purpose or object of an errand. She knew that if she stated her errand she would not be able to see him.



headhunter	A person who identifies and approaches suitable candidates employed elsewhere to fill business positions. A headhunter offering you a wonderful new position at a higher salary.
housekeeping	The regulation of metabolic functions that are common to all cells. I took care of the housekeeping and cooked most of the meals.
job	A workplace as in the expression on the job. This feature allows your computer to queue print job s.
livelihood	A means of securing the necessities of life. <i>He could no longer earn his own livelihood.</i>
<u>lowly</u>	Used of unskilled work (especially domestic work. She d been too good for her lowly position.
<u>menial</u>	A person with a menial job. <i>Menial factory jobs.</i>
milkman	A man who delivers and sells milk.
<u>occupation</u>	The period of time during which a place or position or nation is occupied. <i>The Roman occupation of Britain.</i>
occupational	Relating to a job or profession. An occupational pension scheme.
officiate	Perform duties attached to a particular office or place or function. <i>He baptized children and officiated at weddings.</i>
personnel	The department responsible for hiring and training and placing employees and for setting policies for personnel management. <i>Sales personnel</i> .
placement	Contact established between applicants and prospective employees. Students spend one year on industrial placement .
<u>profession</u>	A body of people engaged in a particular profession. After profession she taught in Maidenhead.
project	Draw a projection of. A history project .
requisition	Demand the performance or occurrence of. Requisition of grain at the point of a gun proved a novel experience for the peasantry.
scullion	A servant assigned the most menial kitchen tasks.
service	Perform a service or services for someone. <i>Service</i> is included in the final bill.
subcontract	Work under a subcontract engage in a subcontract. <i>Subcontract labour.</i>



task	Assign a task to. It task ed his diplomatic skill to effect his departure in safety.
undertaking	The action of undertaking to do something. National transport undertaking s.
vocation	A strong feeling of suitability for a particular career or occupation. <i>GNVQs in Leisure and Tourism will be the introduction to a wide span of</i> vocation s.
work	Give a workout to. The chairman was prepared to work it for Phillip if he was interested.
workshop	Small workplace where handcrafts or manufacturing are done. The play was workshop ped briefly at the Shaw Festival.
