task A piece of work to be done or undertaken.
*A new manager was given the **task** of developing the club s talent.*

Associations of "Chores" (30 Words)

buyout	The purchase of a controlling share in a company.
clientele	The customers of a shop, bar, or place of entertainment. <i>The dancers don't mix with the clientele.</i>
contracted	Reduced in size or pulled together. <i>The contracted pupils of her eyes.</i>
employed	Having your services engaged for; or having a job especially one that pays wages or a salary. <i>Up to 40 per cent of employed people are in part time jobs.</i>
employee	A person employed for wages or salary, especially at non-executive level.
enterprise	A project or undertaking, especially a bold or complex one. <i>He had doubts about the whole enterprise.</i>
errand	The purpose or object of an errand. <i>She knew that if she stated her errand she would not be able to see him.</i>

headhunter	A savage who cuts off and preserves the heads of enemies as trophies. A headhunter offering you a wonderful new position at a higher salary.
housekeeping	The regulation of metabolic functions that are common to all cells. Housekeeping genes.
job	A workplace as in the expression on the job. The job of repairing the engine took several hours.
livelihood	A means of securing the necessities of life. He could no longer earn his own livelihood .
lowly	To a low degree; in a low manner. She d been too good for her lowly position.
menial	A person with a menial job. Menial factory jobs.
milkman	A man who delivers and sells milk.
occupation	Any activity that occupies a person's attention. An occupation bridge.
occupational	Of or relating to the activity or business for which you are trained. An occupational pension scheme.
officiate	Perform duties attached to a particular office or place or function. Who officiated at your wedding.
personnel	The department responsible for hiring and training and placing employees and for setting policies for personnel management. Sales personnel .
placement	The action of finding a home, job, or school for someone. A placement in a special school.
profession	A body of people engaged in a particular profession. They were baptized on profession of faith.
project	Extend out or project in space. Spending was projected at 72 900 million.
requisition	Demand and take for use or service, especially by military or public authority for public service. Requisitions for an Extraordinary General Meeting must state the business to be transacted.
scullion	A servant assigned the most menial kitchen tasks.
service	A company or agency that performs a public service subject to government regulation. The washing machine needs to be serviced .

subcontract	Work under a subcontract engage in a subcontract. <i>Subcontract work.</i>
task	Assign a task to. <i>NATO troops are tasked with separating the warring parties.</i>
undertaking	The action of undertaking to do something. <i>I give an undertaking that we shall proceed with the legislation.</i>
vocation	A body of people doing the same kind of work. <i>Not all of us have a vocation to be nurses or doctors.</i>
work	A place where work is done. <i>She worked hard for better living conditions for the poor.</i>
workshop	A meeting at which a group of people engage in intensive discussion and activity on a particular subject or project. <i>A writers workshop was held on 25 27 July.</i>
