### **Definitions of "Chosen" as a noun**

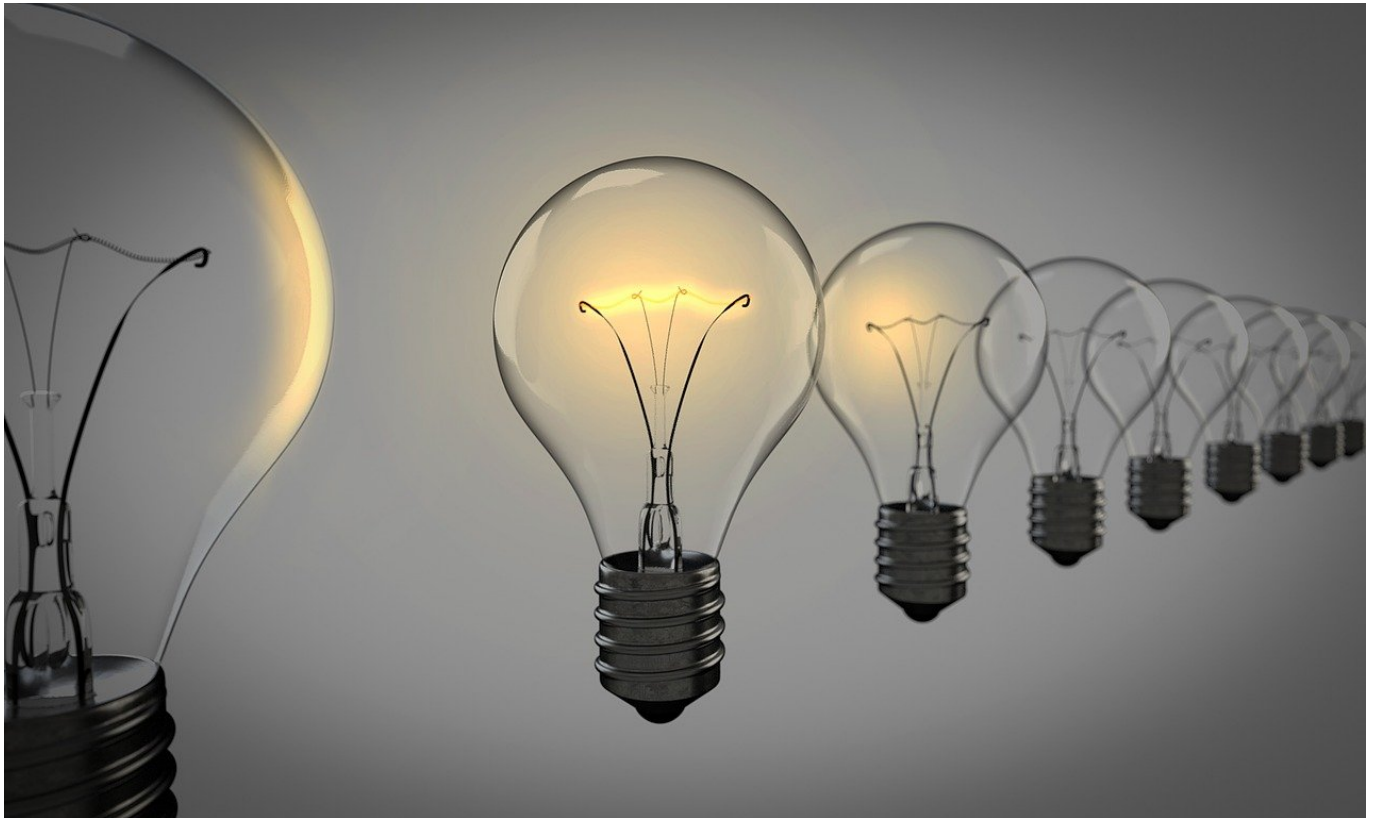
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “chosen” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The name for Korea as a Japanese province (1910-1945).*
- *An exclusive group of people.*



## Synonyms of "Chosen" as a noun (1 Word)

**elect** An exclusive group of people.  
*Success was a sign that they were one of the **elect**.*



## Usage Examples of "Chosen" as a noun

- *She was Mama's chosen.*



## Chosen as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Chosen" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "chosen" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Having been selected as the best or most appropriate.*

### Synonyms of "Chosen" as an adjective (5 Words)

- correct** Correct in opinion or judgment.  
*The government was **correct** to follow a course of defeating inflation.*
- necessary** Unavoidably determined by prior circumstances.  
*They granted the **necessary** planning permission.*

<b>proper</b>	Appropriate for a condition or purpose or occasion or a person's character, needs. <i>An artist needs the <b>proper</b> tools.</i>
<b>required</b>	Required by rule. <i>Eight editions were published each <b>required</b> reading for trainees.</i>
<b>right</b>	Most suitable or right for a particular purpose. <i>Put things <b>right</b>.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Chosen" as an adjective

- *He is by no means a forerunner in his chosen field.*

## Associations of "Chosen" (30 Words)

<b>abstention</b>	Restraint in one's consumption; abstinence. <i>Alcohol consumption versus <b>abstention</b>.</i>
<b>alternative</b>	Serving or used in place of another. <i>An <b>alternative</b> lifestyle.</i>
<b>ballot</b>	The total number of votes cast in a ballot. <i>He won 54 per cent of the <b>ballot</b>.</i>
<b>choice</b>	The right or ability to choose. <i><b>Choice</b> wine.</i>
<b>choose</b>	Pick out select or choose from a number of alternatives. <i>I always <b>choose</b> the fish over the meat courses in this restaurant.</i>
<b>competitively</b>	In a way that compares favorably with others of the same nature, particularly in relation to price. <i>We will have to do some outsourcing to stay <b>competitively</b> priced.</i>
<b>decide</b>	Cause to decide. <i>We finally <b>decided</b> after lengthy deliberations.</i>
<b>elect</b>	Select by a vote for an office or membership. <i>An <b>elect</b> circle of artists.</i>
<b>election</b>	The predestination of some individuals as objects of divine mercy (especially as conceived by Calvinists). <i>She agreed to stand for <b>election</b>.</i>
<b>elective</b>	(of a person or office) appointed or filled by election. <i><b>Elective</b> official.</i>
<b>elector</b>	In the US a member of the electoral college. <i>Close to 60 per cent of the 60 000 registered <b>electors</b> voted.</i>

<b>electorate</b>	All the people in a country or area who are entitled to vote in an election. <i>75 per cent of the <b>electorate</b> voted for a Scottish parliament in some form.</i>
<b>elite</b>	Selected as the best. <i><b>Elite</b> colleges and universities.</i>
<b>especially</b>	Used to single out one person or thing over all others. <i>An <b>especially</b> or specially cautious approach to the danger.</i>
<b>favour</b>	Treat (an injured limb) gently, not putting one's full weight on it. <i>Slashing public spending is a policy that few politicians <b>favour</b>.</i>
<b>hustings</b>	A meeting at which candidates in an election address potential voters. <i>Mrs Jones organized two public <b>hustings</b>.</i>
<b>incoming</b>	(of a communication) being received rather than sent. <i><b>Incoming</b> class.</i>
<b>opt</b>	Make a choice from a range of possibilities. <i>Pupils <b>opting</b> to continue with physics.</i>
<b>optional</b>	Available to be chosen but not obligatory. <i>A wide range of <b>optional</b> excursions is offered.</i>
<b>particular</b>	Detailed information about someone or something. <i>She gets special or <b>particular</b> satisfaction from her volunteer work.</i>
<b>particularly</b>	To a higher degree than is usual or average. <i><b>Particularly</b> able students.</i>
<b>pick</b>	Hit lightly with a picking motion. <i>She finally <b>picked</b> her successor.</i>
<b>referendum</b>	A general vote by the electorate on a single political question which has been referred to them for a direct decision.
<b>scarify</b>	Puncture and scar (the skin), as for purposes or tribal identification or rituals. <i>The men in some African tribes <b>scarify</b> their faces.</i>
<b>select</b>	Pick out select or choose from a number of alternatives. <i>You can <b>select</b> from a range of quality products.</i>
<b>selected</b>	Chosen in preference to another.
<b>selection</b>	A plot of land acquired by selection. <i>The publication of a <b>selection</b> of his poems.</i>
<b>specially</b>	In a special manner. <i>An <b>especially</b> or <b>specially</b> cautious approach to the danger.</i>
<b>suffrage</b>	A vote given in assent to a proposal or in favour of the election of a particular person. <i>Universal adult <b>suffrage</b>.</i>
