## Associations of "Christian" (30 Words)

<b>abbess</b>	A woman who is the head of an abbey of nuns.
<b>apocrypha</b>	14 books of the Old Testament included in the Vulgate (except for II Esdras) but omitted in Jewish and Protestant versions of the Bible; eastern Christian churches (except the Coptic Church) accept all these books as canonical; the Russ.
<b>apologist</b>	A person who argues to defend or justify some policy or institution. <i>An <b>apologist</b> for capital punishment.</i>
<b>apostle</b>	(New Testament) one of the original 12 disciples chosen by Christ to preach his gospel. <i>Kiril and Metodije the <b>apostles</b> of the Slavs.</i>
<b>archdeacon</b>	A senior Christian cleric (in the early Church a deacon, in the modern Anglican Church a priest) to whom a bishop delegates certain responsibilities.
<b>biblical</b>	Relating to or contained in the Bible. <i>The <b>biblical</b> account of creation.</i>
<b>bishop</b>	A chess piece typically with its top shaped like a mitre that can move in any direction along a diagonal on which it stands Each player starts the game with two bishops one moving on white squares and the other on black.
<b>calvinism</b>	The theological system of John Calvin and his followers emphasizing omnipotence of God and salvation by grace alone.
<b>canon</b>	A rule or especially body of rules or principles generally established as valid and fundamental in a field of art or philosophy. <i>A set of ecclesiastical <b>canons</b>.</i>
<b>cathedral</b>	The principal church of a diocese, with which the bishop is officially associated. <i>St Paul's <b>Cathedral</b>.</i>
<b>catholic</b>	Including a wide variety of things; all-embracing. <i><b>Catholic</b> in one s tastes.</i>

<b>church</b>	The body of people who attend or belong to a particular local church. <i><b>Church</b> a woman after childbirth.</i>
<b>dean</b>	The head of a university faculty or department or of a medical school. <i>He is the <b>dean</b> of foreign correspondents.</i>
<b>deity</b>	A representation of a god or goddess, such as a statue or carving. <i>A <b>deity</b> of ancient Greece.</i>
<b>diocese</b>	A district under the pastoral care of a bishop in the Christian Church.
<b>divinity</b>	White creamy fudge made with egg whites. <i>A doctor of <b>divinity</b>.</i>
<b>ecumenism</b>	A movement promoting union between religions (especially between Christian churches).
<b>evangelical</b>	A member of the evangelical tradition in the Christian Church. <i>She was <b>evangelical</b> about organic farming.</i>
<b>evangelist</b>	A zealous advocate of a particular cause. <i>An American television <b>evangelist</b>.</i>
<b>holy</b>	A sacred place of pilgrimage. <i><b>Holy</b> smoke.</i>
<b>liturgy</b>	A religious service conducted according to a liturgy. <i>At the conclusion of the <b>liturgy</b> the Bishop presented the certificates.</i>
<b>martyr</b>	Torture and torment like a martyr. <i>There was no need to <b>martyr</b> themselves again.</i>
<b>minster</b>	A large or important church, typically one of cathedral status in the north of England that was built as part of a monastery. <i>York <b>Minster</b>.</i>
<b>ordination</b>	The action of decreeing or ordaining. <i>The rabbi s family was present for his <b>ordination</b>.</i>
<b>pantheistic</b>	Of or relating to pantheism.
<b>prophet</b>	In Christian use the books of Isaiah Jeremiah Ezekiel Daniel and the twelve minor prophets. <i>The prime minister ignored the <b>prophets</b> of doom.</i>
<b>sacerdotal</b>	Of or relating to a belief in sacerdotalism. <i>Priestly or <b>sacerdotal</b> vestments.</i>
<b>theologian</b>	A person who engages or is an expert in theology.
<b>theological</b>	Of or relating to or concerning theology. <i>A reworking of the past that was partly <b>theological</b>.</i>
