### Definitions of "Chunky" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “chunky” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of food) containing or formed of chunks or thick pieces.*
- *Like or containing small sticky lumps.*
- *Short and thick; as e.g. having short legs and heavy musculature.*
- *Bulky and thick.*
- *(of a person) short and sturdy.*



## Synonyms of "Chunky" as an adjective (20 Words)

<b>beefy</b>	Large and impressively powerful. <i>He shrugged his <b>beefy</b> shoulders.</i>
<b>brawny</b>	Physically strong; muscular. <i>A great <b>brawny</b> brute.</i>
<b>bulky</b>	(of a person) heavily built. <i>A <b>bulky</b> overcoat clad figure.</i>
<b>burly</b>	(of a person) large and strong; heavily built. <i>A big <b>burly</b> man.</i>
<b>dumpy</b>	(of a person) short and stout. <i>A <b>dumpy</b> little dumpling of a woman.</i>
<b>heavy</b>	Large and powerful especially designed for heavy loads or rough work. <i><b>Heavy</b> hydrogen.</i>
<b>hefty</b>	Of considerable weight and size. <i>He aimed a <b>hefty</b> kick at the door.</i>
<b>low-set</b>	Short and thick; as e.g. having short legs and heavy musculature.
<b>lumpy</b>	Like or containing small sticky lumps. <i>There s a <b>lumpy</b> sea running.</i>
<b>meaty</b>	Full of substance or interest. <i>A <b>meaty</b> discussion.</i>

<b>solid</b>	Of good quality and condition solidly built. <i>He thought he could put himself in <b>solid</b> with you by criticizing her.</i>
<b>squat</b>	Having a low center of gravity; built low to the ground. <i>A little church with a <b>squat</b> tower.</i>
<b>squatty</b>	Short and thick; as e.g. having short legs and heavy musculature. <i>A <b>squatty</b> red smokestack.</i>
<b>stocky</b>	Having a short and solid form or stature. <i><b>Stocky</b> legs.</i>
<b>stumpy</b>	Short and thick; as e.g. having short legs and heavy musculature. <i>A <b>stumpy</b> ungainly figure.</i>
<b>sturdily built</b>	Not making concessions.
<b>sturdy</b>	(of a person or their body) strongly and solidly built. <i>He had a <b>sturdy</b> muscular physique.</i>
<b>thick</b>	Not thin of a specific thickness or of relatively great extent from one surface to the opposite usually in the smallest of the three solid dimensions. <i>The top was <b>thick</b> with dust.</i>
<b>thickset</b>	(of a person or animal) heavily or solidly built; stocky. <i>A <b>thickset</b> boy with dark greasy hair.</i>
<b>well built</b>	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.



## Usage Examples of "Chunky" as an adjective

- *The dumplings were chunky pieces of uncooked dough.*
- *A chunky bracelet.*
- *Ramen with chunky pieces of beef, chicken, or pork.*
- *A chunky soup.*
- *A squat, chunky man whose face was stitched by tiny red veins.*

- *Some people seem born to be square and chunky.*
