### Definitions of "Churn" as a noun

- *A large metal container for milk.*
- *A vessel in which cream is agitated to separate butterfat from buttermilk.*
- *A machine for making butter by shaking milk or cream.*





## Synonyms of "Churn" as a noun (7 Words)

- beater** An implement for beating.  
*I bought a **beater** and drove that for a few years.*
- blender** A person or thing that mixes things together, in particular an electric mixing machine used in food preparation for liquidizing, chopping, or pureeing.
- butter churn** An edible emulsion of fat globules made by churning milk or cream; for cooking and table use.
- food processor** Any substance that can be metabolized by an animal to give energy and build tissue.
- liquidizer** An electrically powered mixer with whirling blades that mix or chop or liquefy foods.
- stirrer** An object or mechanical device used for stirring something.
- whisk** A utensil for whipping eggs or cream.  
*A **whisk** round St Basil s cathedral.*

## Churn as a Verb

### Definitions of "Churn" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "churn" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Shake (milk or cream) in a machine in order to produce butter.*
- *Produce (butter) by churning milk or cream.*
- *Break up the surface of (an area of ground).*
- *(of a broker) encourage frequent turnover of (investments) in order to generate*

commission.

- *Be agitated.*
- *(with reference to liquid) move or cause to move about vigorously.*
- *Have an unpleasant disturbed feeling.*
- *Stir (cream) vigorously in order to make butter.*



## Synonyms of "Churn" as a verb (14 Words)

**agitate** Cause to be agitated excited or roused.  
***Agitate** the water to disperse the oil.*

**be turbulent** Form or compose.

**boil** Come to the boiling point and change from a liquid to vapor.  
***Boil** bedclothes and towels.*

**disturb** Tamper with.  
*Don't **disturb** the patient's wounds by moving him too rapidly.*



<b>foam</b>	Become bubbly or frothy or foaming. <i>The sea <b>foamed</b> beneath them.</i>
<b>froth</b>	Make froth or foam and become bubbly. <i>The boiling soup was <b>frothing</b>.</i>
<b>heave</b>	Produce (a sigh). <i>My stomach <b>heaved</b>.</i>
<b>moil</b>	Move around in confusion or agitation. <i>Men who <b>moiled</b> for gold.</i>
<b>roil</b>	Be agitated. <i>The sea <b>roiled</b> below her.</i>
<b>seethe</b>	(of a place) be crowded with people or things moving about in a rapid or hectic way. <i>We cascaded down the stairs and <b>seethed</b> across the station.</i>
<b>stir</b>	Stir the feelings emotions or peace of. <i>Desmond <b>stirred</b> his tea and ate a biscuit.</i>
<b>stir up</b>	To begin moving.
<b><u>swirl</u></b>	Move in a twisting or spiralling pattern. <i>The leaves <b>swirled</b> in the autumn wind.</i>
<b>toss</b>	Throw or toss with a light motion. <i>Suzy <b>tossed</b> her bag on to the sofa.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Churn" as a verb

- *The sea was churning in the storm.*
- *The women were churning butter and making cheese.*
- *You never feel rested because your mind is always churning.*
- *The seas churned.*
- *The cream is ripened before it is churned.*
- *Her stomach was churning at the thought of the ordeal.*
- *The water was churned by a flotilla of boats and ferries.*
- *Vast crowds had churned the area into a sea of mud.*
- *These brokers churn the client's portfolio to generate an income for themselves.*





## Associations of "Churn" (30 Words)

- boil** With reference to food cook or be cooked by immersing in boiling water or stock.  
*Bring the sauce to the **boil** and simmer for 10 minutes.*
- borax** An ore of boron consisting of hydrated sodium borate; used as a flux or cleansing agent.
- bubble** Form produce or emit bubbles.  
***Bubble** gas through a liquid.*
- cloud** Billow up in the form of a cloud.  
*Once you are logged in to your **cloud** storage space you can upload files to it and share them with others.*



<b>dampen</b>	Check; keep in check (a fire). <i>Slider switches on the mixers can <b>dampen</b> the drums.</i>
<b>drizzle</b>	(in cooking) a thin stream of a liquid ingredient trickled over food. <i>A steady <b>drizzle</b> has been falling since 3 a m.</i>
<b>fizz</b>	The quality of being fizzy effervescence. <i>A glass of your favourite <b>fizz</b>.</i>
<b>fog</b>	A state or cause of perplexity or confusion. <i>Hot steam drifted about her <b>fogging</b> up the window.</i>
<b>froth</b>	Become bubbly or frothy or foaming. <i>The cinema lobby <b>frothed</b> with indignation.</i>
<b>frothy</b>	Full of or covered with a mass of small bubbles. <i>Foamy or <b>frothy</b> beer.</i>
<b>haze</b>	Obscure with a haze. <i>The cold air has no pollution and very little <b>haze</b>.</i>
<b>lather</b>	Rub soap on to the body until a lather is produced. <i>This unfit horse <b>lathers</b> easily.</i>
<b>maelstrom</b>	A powerful circular current of water (usually the result of conflicting tides). <i>The train station was a <b>maelstrom</b> of crowds.</i>
<b>mist</b>	Become covered with mist. <i>The glass was beginning to <b>mist</b> up.</i>
<b>misty</b>	Wet with mist. <i>The <b>misty</b> air above the frozen river.</i>
<b>moisten</b>	Moisten with fine drops. <i>Her eyes <b>moistened</b>.</i>
<b>purl</b>	Knit with a purl stitch. <i>Knit one <b>purl</b> one.</i>
<b>rile</b>	Make (someone) annoyed or irritated. <i>He has been <b>riled</b> by suggestions that his Arsenal future is in doubt.</i>
<b>rinse</b>	Rinse one's mouth and throat with mouthwash. <i>Always <b>rinse</b> your hair thoroughly.</i>
<b>roil</b>	Be agitated. <i>Winds <b>roil</b> these waters.</i>
<b>shower</b>	Cause a mass of small things to fall in a shower. <i>A <b>shower</b> of awards.</i>
<b>snow</b>	A dessert or other dish resembling snow. <i>Carbon dioxide <b>snow</b>.</i>

- soap** Wash with soap.  
*A bar of **soap**.*
- steam** Cook food by heating it in steam from boiling water.  
*A **steam** locomotive.*
- storm** Storm windows.  
*Commandos **stormed** a hijacked plane early today.*
- swirl** A quantity of something moving in a twisting or spiralling pattern.  
*The leaves **swirled** in the autumn wind.*
- vortex** A powerful circular current of water (usually the result of conflicting tides).  
*We were caught in a **vortex** of water.*
- wash** Wash or flow against.  
*He **washed** the dirt from his coat.*
- weather** Change under the action or influence of the weather.  
*Every day we have **weather** conditions and yesterday was no exception.*
- whirlpool** A quickly rotating mass of water in a river or sea into which objects may be drawn, typically caused by the meeting of conflicting currents.  
*He was drawing her down into an emotional **whirlpool**.*
