<b>film</b>	A story or event recorded by a camera as a set of moving images and shown in a cinema or on television. <i>Clear plastic <b>film</b> between the layers of glass.</i>
<b>films</b>	A thin coating or layer. <i>The <b>film</b> was shot on location.</i>
<b>movie house</b>	A form of entertainment that enacts a story by sound and a sequence of images giving the illusion of continuous movement.
<b>movie theater</b>	A form of entertainment that enacts a story by sound and a sequence of images giving the illusion of continuous movement.
<b>movie theatre</b>	A form of entertainment that enacts a story by sound and a sequence of images giving the illusion of continuous movement.
<b>picture palace</b>	Illustrations used to decorate or explain a text.
<b>pictures</b>	A situation treated as an observable object. <i>They showed us the <b>pictures</b> of their wedding.</i>
<b>the pictures</b>	A visual representation (of an object or scene or person or abstraction) produced on a surface.

## Associations of "Cinema" (30 Words)

- anteroom** An antechamber, typically serving as a waiting room.
- blockbuster** An unusually successful hit with widespread popularity and huge sales (especially a movie or play or recording or novel).  
*A **blockbuster** film.*
- cinematic** Of or pertaining to or characteristic of the cinema.  
*The **cinematic** feel of their video.*
- comedian** An actor in a comedy.  
*He s a real **comedian** this fellow.*
- debut** Make one s debut.  
*The band **debuts** a new song or two each month.*

<b>dramaturgy</b>	The theory and practice of dramatic composition. <i>Studies of Shakespeare s <b>dramaturgy</b>.</i>
<b>enlarger</b>	An apparatus for enlarging or reducing negatives or positives.
<b>film</b>	Be well or badly suited to portrayal in a film. <i>The table was covered with a <b>film</b> of dust.</i>
<b>flick</b>	Remove with a flick of the hand. <i>He <b>flicked</b> his Bic.</i>
<b>impresario</b>	The manager of a musical, theatrical, or operatic company.
<b>minstrel</b>	Celebrate by singing in the style of minstrels. <i>The exaggerated dialect of blackface <b>minstrels</b>.</i>
<b>movie</b>	A form of entertainment that enacts a story by sound and a sequence of images giving the illusion of continuous movement. <i>They went to a <b>movie</b> every Saturday night.</i>
<b>nickelodeon</b>	A cinema with an admission fee of one nickel.
<b>performer</b>	An entertainer who performs a dramatic or musical work for an audience. <i>A circus <b>performer</b>.</i>
<b>playwright</b>	A person who writes plays.
<b>premiere</b>	Be performed for the first time. <i>The world <b>premiere</b> of his new play.</i>
<b>preview</b>	Display (a product, film, etc.) before it is made generally available. <i>The teacher should <b>preview</b> teaching aids to ensure that they are at the right level.</i>
<b>projector</b>	A device that is used to project rays of light, especially an apparatus with a system of lenses for projecting slides or film on to a screen. <i>He was a tobacco grower and <b>projector</b>.</i>
<b>proscenium</b>	The part of a theatre stage in front of the curtain.
<b>puppet</b>	A small figure of a person operated from above with strings by a puppeteer. <i>A <b>puppet</b> show.</i>
<b>screen</b>	Separate something from something else with or as if with a screen. <i>A branch whipped across the <b>screen</b> and tore off one of the wipers.</i>
<b>screening</b>	Testing objects or persons in order to identify those with particular characteristics. <i>Filmgoers were shut out in droves from the film s many <b>screenings</b> in Cannes.</i>
<b>snap</b>	Close with a snapping motion. <i>McIllvanney <b>snapped</b> at her.</i>

<b>stunt</b>	Perform a stunt or stunts. <i>Some weeds produce chemicals that <b>stunt</b> the plant s growth.</i>
<b><u>theater</u></b>	A building where theatrical performances or motion-picture shows can be presented. <i>He served in the Vietnam <b>theater</b> for three years.</i>
<b><u>trilogy</u></b>	A group of three related things. <i>A <b>trilogy</b> of cases reflected this development.</i>
<b>troupe</b>	A group of dancers, actors, or other entertainers who tour to different venues. <i>A <b>troupe</b> of singers.</i>
<b><u>usher</u></b>	An assistant teacher. <i>A waiter <b>ushered</b> me to a table.</i>
<b>vaudeville</b>	A type of entertainment popular chiefly in the US in the early 20th century, featuring a mixture of speciality acts such as burlesque comedy and song and dance. <i>His comedic roots are in <b>vaudeville</b>.</i>
<b>video</b>	Computer science the appearance of text and graphics on a video display. <i>He <b>videoed</b> our wedding.</i>
