Definitions of "Circulate" as a verb

- *Move through a space, circuit or system, returning to the starting point.*
- *Move around freely from person to person or from place to place.*
- *Move in circles.*
- *Pass from place to place or person to person.*
- *Cause to be distributed.*
- *Cause be distributed.*
- *Cause to become widely known.*
- *Send copies of a letter or leaflet to (a group of people).*
- *Cause to move around.*
- *Cause to move in a circuit or system.*
- *Become widely known and passed on.*
- *Move around freely.*
- *Move continuously or freely through a closed system or area.*

- *Move around a social function in order to talk to many different people.*

air	Expose a room to the open air in order to ventilate it. <i>He took the opportunity of airing his knowledge of antiquity.</i>
be passed around	Be priced at.
broadcast	Broadcast over the airwaves as in radio or television. <i>We don t want to broadcast our unhappiness to the world.</i>
circularise	Canvass by distributing letters.
circularize	Make circular. <i>They circularize prospective purchasers at regular intervals.</i>
communicate	Join or connect. <i>The prisoner was forbidden to communicate with his family.</i>
course	Move swiftly through or over. <i>He often courses hares.</i>
<u>diffuse</u>	Spread or diffuse through. <i>Oxygen molecules diffuse across the membrane.</i>
disperse	Move away from each other. <i>Storms can disperse seeds via high altitudes.</i>
<u>disseminate</u>	Spread throughout an organ or the body. <i>There is a subset of these low grade tumours that can disseminate and migrate.</i>
distribute	Cause be distributed. <i>Information leaflets are being distributed to hotels.</i>
flow	Fall or flow in a certain way. <i>Her long black hair flowed down her back.</i>
get around	Go or come after and bring or take back.
go around	Be the right size or shape; fit correctly or as desired.
go round	To be spent or finished.
go the rounds	Begin or set in motion.
make known	Prepare for eating by applying heat.
<u>mingle</u>	Get involved or mixed-up with. <i>A smell which mingled disinfectant and soap.</i>
move round	Give an incentive for action.
pass around	Pass by.
pass on	Be inherited by.

propagate	Cause to propagate as by grafting or layering. <i>The plant propagates freely from stem cuttings.</i>
put about	Make an investment.
socialize	Prepare for social life. <i>The old man hates to socialize.</i>
spread	Cover by spreading something over. <i>Spread the bread with cheese.</i>
spread about	Spread across or over.
spread around	Spread out or open from a closed or folded state.
transmit	Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission. <i>Sexually transmitted diseases.</i>

- *The couple circulated, chatting to their guests.*
- *The air here does not circulate.*
- *The fan circulates the air in the room.*
- *They were circulating the list to conservation groups.*
- *Rumours of his arrest circulated.*
- *Tutors were circulated with the handout.*
- *The fan circulates hot air around the oven.*
- *She circulates among royalty.*
- *Blood circulates in my veins.*
- *Antibodies circulate in the bloodstream.*

asunder	Into parts or pieces. <i>As wide asunder as pole from pole.</i>
broadcast	Broadcast over the airwaves as in radio or television. Broadcast seeds.
convolute	Rolled longitudinally upon itself. <i>A convolute petal.</i>
convolve	Roll or coil together; entwine.
cycle	Ride a motorcycle. <i>Schubert s song cycles.</i>
diffuse	Spread or diffuse through. <i>Technologies diffuse rapidly.</i>
dispel	Make (a doubt, feeling, or belief) disappear. <i>The brightness of the day did nothing to dispel Elaine s dejection.</i>
disperse	Denoting a phase dispersed in another phase as in a colloid. <i>The crowds dispersed.</i>
disseminate	Cause to become widely known. <i>There is a subset of these low grade tumours that can disseminate and migrate.</i>
dissipate	Move away from each other. <i>He inherited but then dissipated his father s fortune.</i>
distribute	Be distributed or spread as in statistical analyses. <i>Information leaflets are being distributed to hotels.</i>
diversify	Spread into new habitats and produce variety or variegate. Diversify a course of study.
effluence	The action of flowing out.
flow	The act of flowing or streaming continuous progression. <i>The museum had planned carefully for the flow of visitors.</i>
imbue	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably imbued with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>
intersperse	Scatter among or between other things; place here and there. Intersperse exclamation marks in the text.
pervasiveness	The quality of filling or spreading throughout. <i>The pervasiveness of the odor of cabbage in tenement hallways.</i>
propagate	Cause to propagate as by grafting or layering. <i>Sound and light propagate in this medium.</i>

<u>revolve</u>	Move in an orbit. <i>Their whole lives revolved around the company.</i>
<u>rotate</u>	Change the position of (tyres) on a motor vehicle to distribute wear. <i>Interns have to rotate for a few months.</i>
<u>scatter</u>	The act of scattering. <i>There are many watermills scattered throughout the marshlands.</i>
scattered	(of electromagnetic radiation or particles) deflected or diffused. <i>The forecast is for scattered showers.</i>
<u>spin</u>	Spin dry clothes. <i>They had to spin the ball wide.</i>
<u>spray</u>	An act of spraying something. <i>Cats usually spray areas they have sprayed before.</i>
spread	The fact or process of spreading over an area. <i>Spread each slice thinly with mayonnaise.</i>
<u>sprinkle</u>	Place or attach (a number of things) at irregularly spaced intervals. <i>He sprinkled his conversation with quotations.</i>
strew	Cover (a surface or area) with untidily scattered things. <i>Strew toys all over the carpet.</i>
suffuse	Cause to spread or flush or flood through, over, or across. <i>His whole frame suffused with a cold dew.</i>
turn	Cause to change or turn into something different assume new characteristics. <i>Turn the mould upside down.</i>
<u>whirl</u>	The act of rotating rapidly. <i>The event was all part of the mad social whirl.</i>
