## **Citizen as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Citizen" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “citizen” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A native or naturalized member of a state or other political community.*
- *An inhabitant of a particular town or city.*
- *A legally recognized subject or national of a state or commonwealth, either native or naturalized.*



## Synonyms of "Citizen" as a noun (10 Words)

<b>householder</b>	Someone who owns a home.
<b>inhabitant</b>	A person who inhabits a particular place.
<b><u>local</u></b>	A local branch of an organization especially a trade union. <i>The street was full of <b>locals</b> and tourists.</i>
<b><u>national</u></b>	A national newspaper as opposed to a local one. <i>She finished 16th at the <b>nationals</b> that year.</i>
<b><u>native</u></b>	Indigenous plants and animals. <i>New York in the summer was too hot even for the <b>natives</b>.</i>
<b>passport holder</b>	Any authorization to pass or go somewhere.
<b>resident</b>	A pupil who boards at a boarding school. <i>It was a beautiful hamlet with just 100 <b>residents</b>.</i>

**subject** A person who is subjected to experimental or other observational procedures someone who is an object of investigation.  
*He didn't want to discuss that **subject**.*

**townsman** A male resident of a particular town or city (often used to contrast with a visitor or a person living in the country).  
*A **townsman** of Bury.*

**townswoman** A female resident of a particular town or city.  
*We know more about townswomen than we do of the rural-dwelling women.*



## Usage Examples of "Citizen" as a noun

- A British citizen.
- The good citizens of Edinburgh.



## Associations of "Citizen" (30 Words)

<b>abide</b>	Live; dwell. <i>I said I would <b>abide</b> by their decision.</i>
<b>borough</b>	A town (as distinct from a city) with a corporation and privileges granted by a royal charter.
<b>burgher</b>	A descendant of a Dutch or Portuguese colonist in Sri Lanka. <i>The poem is not the sort of thing the sturdy <b>burghers</b> of Manchester would wish to read.</i>
<b>census</b>	Conduct a census. <i>They <b>censused</b> the deer in the forest.</i>
<b>civil</b>	Relating to civil law. <i>Even if he didn't like them he should have been <b>civil</b>.</i>
<b>civilian</b>	Relating to civilians. <i><b>Civilian</b> life.</i>

<b>commoner</b>	(at some British universities) an undergraduate who does not have a scholarship. <i>Cattle and ponies owned by the <b>commoners</b>.</i>
<b>denizen</b>	A person, animal, or plant that lives or is found in a particular place. <i><b>Denizens</b> of the deep.</i>
<b>disfranchise</b>	Deprive of voting rights.
<b>dwell</b>	Inhabit or live in; be an inhabitant of. <i>This kind of fish <b>dwells</b> near the bottom of the ocean.</i>
<b>dweller</b>	A person or animal that lives in or at a specified place. <i>City <b>dwellers</b>.</i>
<b>elector</b>	In the US a member of the electoral college. <i>Close to 60 per cent of the 60 000 registered <b>electors</b> voted.</i>
<b>habitant</b>	An inhabitant. <i>The <b>habitant</b> farmhouses of old Quebec.</i>
<b>habitat</b>	The type of environment in which an organism or group normally lives or occurs. <i>A marine <b>habitat</b>.</i>
<b>immigrant</b>	A person who comes to live permanently in a foreign country. <i><b>Immigrant</b> workers.</i>
<b>inhabit</b>	Be an inhabitant of or reside in. <i>Strange notions <b>inhabited</b> her mind.</i>
<b>inhabitant</b>	A person who fulfils the residential or legal requirements for being a member of a state or parish.
<b>living</b>	People who are still living. <i>He was offered the <b>living</b> of St Katherine s.</i>
<b>national</b>	Of or relating to nationality. <i>Isolationism is a strictly <b>national</b> policy.</i>
<b>nationality</b>	People having common origins or traditions and often comprising a nation. <i>Men of Spanish <b>nationality</b>.</i>
<b>native</b>	Used in names of animals or plants resembling others familiar elsewhere e g native bee. <i>An eighteen year old Brooklyn <b>native</b>.</i>
<b>plebeian</b>	Of or belonging to the commoners of ancient Rome. <i>His square <b>plebeian</b> nose.</i>

<b>plebiscite</b>	The direct vote of all the members of an electorate on an important public question such as a change in the constitution. <i>The administration will hold a <b>plebiscite</b> for the approval of constitutional reforms.</i>
<b>populate</b>	Fill or be present in (a place or sphere). <i>A cosy rural town <b>populated</b> with friendly folk.</i>
<b>population</b>	The number of inhabitants (either the total number or the number of a particular race or class) in a given place (country or city etc). <i>Areas of sparse <b>population</b>.</i>
<b>referendum</b>	A general vote by the electorate on a single political question which has been referred to them for a direct decision.
<b>reside</b>	Be situated. <i>The paintings now <b>reside</b> on the walls of a restaurant.</i>
<b>resident</b>	Having quarters on the premises of one's work. <i>An intangible computer program <b>resident</b> on a magnetic disk.</i>
<b>vote</b>	Express one's preference for a candidate or for a measure or resolution cast a vote. <i>American women got the <b>vote</b> in 1920.</i>
<b>voter</b>	A person who votes or has the right to vote at an election.
