Citizen as a Noun

Definitions of "Citizen" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “citizen” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A native or naturalized member of a state or other political community.*
- *An inhabitant of a particular town or city.*
- *A legally recognized subject or national of a state or commonwealth, either native or naturalized.*



Synonyms of "Citizen" as a noun (10 Words)

householder	Someone who owns a home.
inhabitant	A person who inhabits a particular place.
<u>local</u>	A local branch of an organization especially a trade union. <i>The street was full of locals and tourists.</i>
<u>national</u>	A national newspaper as opposed to a local one. <i>She finished 16th at the nationals that year.</i>
<u>native</u>	Indigenous plants and animals. <i>New York in the summer was too hot even for the natives.</i>
passport holder	Any authorization to pass or go somewhere.
resident	A pupil who boards at a boarding school. <i>It was a beautiful hamlet with just 100 residents.</i>

subject

A person who is subjected to experimental or other observational procedures someone who is an object of investigation.

*He didn't want to discuss that **subject**.*

townsman

A male resident of a particular town or city (often used to contrast with a visitor or a person living in the country).

*A **townsman** of Bury.*

townswoman

A female resident of a particular town or city.

We know more about townswomen than we do of the rural-dwelling women.



Usage Examples of "Citizen" as a noun

- *A British citizen.*
- *The good citizens of Edinburgh.*



Associations of "Citizen" (30 Words)

abide	Live; dwell. <i>I said I would abide by their decision.</i>
borough	A town (as distinct from a city) with a corporation and privileges granted by a royal charter.
burgher	A descendant of a Dutch or Portuguese colonist in Sri Lanka. <i>The poem is not the sort of thing the sturdy burghers of Manchester would wish to read.</i>
census	Conduct a census. <i>They censused the deer in the forest.</i>
civil	Relating to civil law. <i>Even if he didn't like them he should have been civil.</i>
civilian	Relating to civilians. <i>Civilian life.</i>

<u>commoner</u>	(at some British universities) an undergraduate who does not have a scholarship. <i>Cattle and ponies owned by the commoners.</i>
denizen	A person, animal, or plant that lives or is found in a particular place. <i>Denizens of the deep.</i>
disfranchise	Deprive of voting rights.
<u> dwell</u>	Inhabit or live in; be an inhabitant of. <i>This kind of fish dwells near the bottom of the ocean.</i>
dweller	A person or animal that lives in or at a specified place. <i>City dwellers.</i>
elector	In the US a member of the electoral college. <i>Close to 60 per cent of the 60 000 registered electors voted.</i>
habitant	An inhabitant. <i>The habitant farmhouses of old Quebec.</i>
<u>habitat</u>	The type of environment in which an organism or group normally lives or occurs. <i>A marine habitat.</i>
immigrant	A person who comes to live permanently in a foreign country. <i>Immigrant workers.</i>
<u>inhabit</u>	Be an inhabitant of or reside in. <i>Strange notions inhabited her mind.</i>
inhabitant	A person who fulfils the residential or legal requirements for being a member of a state or parish.
<u>living</u>	People who are still living. <i>He was offered the living of St Katherine s.</i>
<u>national</u>	Of or relating to nationality. <i>Isolationism is a strictly national policy.</i>
nationality	People having common origins or traditions and often comprising a nation. <i>Men of Spanish nationality.</i>
<u>native</u>	Used in names of animals or plants resembling others familiar elsewhere e g native bee. <i>An eighteen year old Brooklyn native.</i>
<u>plebeian</u>	Of or belonging to the commoners of ancient Rome. <i>His square plebeian nose.</i>

plebiscite	The direct vote of all the members of an electorate on an important public question such as a change in the constitution. <i>The administration will hold a plebiscite for the approval of constitutional reforms.</i>
populate	Fill or be present in (a place or sphere). <i>A cosy rural town populated with friendly folk.</i>
population	The number of inhabitants (either the total number or the number of a particular race or class) in a given place (country or city etc). <i>Areas of sparse population.</i>
referendum	A general vote by the electorate on a single political question which has been referred to them for a direct decision.
reside	Be situated. <i>The paintings now reside on the walls of a restaurant.</i>
resident	Having quarters on the premises of one's work. <i>An intangible computer program resident on a magnetic disk.</i>
vote	Express one's preference for a candidate or for a measure or resolution cast a vote. <i>American women got the vote in 1920.</i>
voter	A person who votes or has the right to vote at an election.
