| <b>borough</b>                  | An English town that forms the constituency of a member of parliament.   |
| <b>burgher</b>                  | A citizen of a town or city, typically a member of the wealthy bourgeoisie.<br><i>The poem is not the sort of thing the sturdy <b>burghers</b> of Manchester would wish to read.</i> |
| <b>census</b>                   | Conduct a census.<br><i>A traffic <b>census</b>.</i>   |
| <a href="#"><u>civil</u></a>    | Relating to civil law.<br><i><b>Civil</b> aviation.</i>  |
| <a href="#"><u>civilian</u></a> | Relating to civilians.<br><i><b>Civilian</b> clothes.</i>  |
| <a href="#"><u>commoner</u></a> | One of the ordinary or common people, as opposed to the aristocracy or to royalty.<br><i><b>Commoners</b> centuries old grazing rights.</i>  |
| <b>denizen</b>                  | A person who inhabits a particular place.<br><i><b>Denizens</b> of the deep.</i>   |
| <b>disfranchise</b>             | Deprive of voting rights.  |
| <a href="#"><u>dwell</u></a>    | Live in or at a specified place.<br><i>This kind of fish <b>dwells</b> near the bottom of the ocean.</i>   |
| <b>dweller</b>                  | A person or animal that lives in or at a specified place.<br><i>City <b>dwellers</b>.</i>  |
| <b>elector</b>                  | In the US a member of the electoral college.<br><i>Close to 60 per cent of the 60 000 registered <b>electors</b> voted.</i>  |
| <b>habitant</b>                 | An inhabitant.<br><i>The <b>habitant</b> farmhouses of old Quebec.</i>   |

| <b><u>habitat</u></b>    | The natural home or environment of an animal, plant, or other organism.<br><i>Wild chimps in their natural <b>habitat</b>.</i>   |
| <b>immigrant</b>         | A person who comes to a country where they were not born in order to settle there.<br><i>She was born in New York the daughter of <b>immigrant</b> parents.</i>  |
| <b><u>inhabit</u></b>    | Inhabit or live in be an inhabitant of.<br><i>Strange notions <b>inhabited</b> her mind.</i>   |
| <b>inhabitant</b>        | A person who fulfils the residential or legal requirements for being a member of a state or parish.  |
| <b><u>living</u></b>     | People who are still living.<br><i>A <b>living</b> language.</i>   |
| <b><u>national</u></b>   | Owned or maintained for the public by the national government.<br><i>The <b>national</b> government.</i>   |
| <b>nationality</b>       | An ethnic group forming a part of one or more political nations.<br><i>Men of Spanish <b>nationality</b>.</i>  |
| <b><u>native</u></b>     | Used in names of animals or plants resembling others familiar elsewhere e.g native bee.<br><i>The art of the <b>natives</b> of the northwest coast.</i>  |
| <b><u>plebeian</u></b>   | Of or belonging to the commoners of ancient Rome.<br><i>Two dancers one royal and one <b>plebeian</b>.</i>   |
| <b>plebiscite</b>        | The direct vote of all the members of an electorate on an important public question such as a change in the constitution.<br><i>The administration will hold a <b>plebiscite</b> for the approval of constitutional reforms.</i> |
| <b>populate</b>          | Fill with inhabitants.<br><i><b>Populate</b> the forest with deer and wild boar for hunting.</i>   |
| <b><u>population</u></b> | Each of three groups (designated I, II, and III) into which stars can be approximately divided on the basis of their manner of formation.<br><i>He deplored the <b>population</b> of colonies with convicted criminals.</i>      |
| <b>referendum</b>        | A legislative act is referred for final approval to a popular vote by the electorate.  |
| <b><u>reside</u></b>     | (of a quality) be present or inherent in something.<br><i>People who work in the city actually <b>reside</b> in neighbouring towns.</i>  |
| <b>resident</b>          | A guest in a hotel who stays for one or more nights.<br><i>An intangible computer program <b>resident</b> on a magnetic disk.</i>  |
| <b><u>vote</u></b>       | An act of giving or registering a vote.<br><i>They put the question to a <b>vote</b>.</i>  |
