Associations of "Citizens" (30 Words)

abide	Live; dwell. <i>I said I would abide by their decision.</i>
borough	An English town that forms the constituency of a member of parliament.
burgher	A citizen of a town or city, typically a member of the wealthy bourgeoisie. <i>The poem is not the sort of thing the sturdy burghers of Manchester would wish to read.</i>
census	Conduct a census. <i>A traffic census.</i>
civil	Relating to civil law. <i>Civil aviation.</i>
civilian	Relating to civilians. <i>Civilian clothes.</i>
commoner	One of the ordinary or common people, as opposed to the aristocracy or to royalty. <i>Commoners centuries old grazing rights.</i>
denizen	A person who inhabits a particular place. <i>Denizens of the deep.</i>
disfranchise	Deprive of voting rights.
dwell	Live in or at a specified place. <i>This kind of fish dwells near the bottom of the ocean.</i>
dweller	A person or animal that lives in or at a specified place. <i>City dwellers.</i>
elector	In the US a member of the electoral college. <i>Close to 60 per cent of the 60 000 registered electors voted.</i>
habitant	An inhabitant. <i>The habitant farmhouses of old Quebec.</i>

<u>habitat</u>	The natural home or environment of an animal, plant, or other organism. <i>Wild chimps in their natural habitat.</i>
immigrant	A person who comes to a country where they were not born in order to settle there. <i>She was born in New York the daughter of immigrant parents.</i>
<u>inhabit</u>	Inhabit or live in be an inhabitant of. <i>Strange notions inhabited her mind.</i>
inhabitant	A person who fulfils the residential or legal requirements for being a member of a state or parish.
<u>living</u>	People who are still living. <i>A living language.</i>
<u>national</u>	Owned or maintained for the public by the national government. <i>The national government.</i>
nationality	An ethnic group forming a part of one or more political nations. <i>Men of Spanish nationality.</i>
<u>native</u>	Used in names of animals or plants resembling others familiar elsewhere e.g native bee. <i>The art of the natives of the northwest coast.</i>
<u>plebeian</u>	Of or belonging to the commoners of ancient Rome. <i>Two dancers one royal and one plebeian.</i>
plebiscite	The direct vote of all the members of an electorate on an important public question such as a change in the constitution. <i>The administration will hold a plebiscite for the approval of constitutional reforms.</i>
populate	Fill with inhabitants. <i>Populate the forest with deer and wild boar for hunting.</i>
<u>population</u>	Each of three groups (designated I, II, and III) into which stars can be approximately divided on the basis of their manner of formation. <i>He deplored the population of colonies with convicted criminals.</i>
referendum	A legislative act is referred for final approval to a popular vote by the electorate.
<u>reside</u>	(of a quality) be present or inherent in something. <i>People who work in the city actually reside in neighbouring towns.</i>
resident	A guest in a hotel who stays for one or more nights. <i>An intangible computer program resident on a magnetic disk.</i>
<u>vote</u>	An act of giving or registering a vote. <i>They put the question to a vote.</i>

voter A citizen who has a legal right to vote.
