## Associations of "Citizens" (30 Words)

<b>abide</b>	Live; dwell. <i>I said I would <b>abide</b> by their decision.</i>
<b>borough</b>	An English town that forms the constituency of a member of parliament.
<b>burgher</b>	A citizen of a town or city, typically a member of the wealthy bourgeoisie. <i>The poem is not the sort of thing the sturdy <b>burghers</b> of Manchester would wish to read.</i>
<b>census</b>	Conduct a census. <i>A traffic <b>census</b>.</i>
<a href="#">civil</a>	Relating to civil law. <i><b>Civil</b> aviation.</i>
<a href="#">civilian</a>	Relating to civilians. <i><b>Civilian</b> clothes.</i>
<a href="#">commoner</a>	One of the ordinary or common people, as opposed to the aristocracy or to royalty. <i><b>Commoners</b> centuries old grazing rights.</i>
<b>denizen</b>	A person who inhabits a particular place. <i><b>Denizens</b> of the deep.</i>
<b>disfranchise</b>	Deprive of voting rights.
<a href="#">dwell</a>	Live in or at a specified place. <i>This kind of fish <b>dwells</b> near the bottom of the ocean.</i>
<b>dweller</b>	A person or animal that lives in or at a specified place. <i>City <b>dwellers</b>.</i>
<b>elector</b>	In the US a member of the electoral college. <i>Close to 60 per cent of the 60 000 registered <b>electors</b> voted.</i>
<b>habitant</b>	An inhabitant. <i>The <b>habitant</b> farmhouses of old Quebec.</i>

<b>habitat</b>	The natural home or environment of an animal, plant, or other organism. <i>Wild chimps in their natural <b>habitat</b>.</i>
<b>immigrant</b>	A person who comes to a country where they were not born in order to settle there. <i>She was born in New York the daughter of <b>immigrant</b> parents.</i>
<b>inhabit</b>	Inhabit or live in be an inhabitant of. <i>Strange notions <b>inhabited</b> her mind.</i>
<b>inhabitant</b>	A person who fulfils the residential or legal requirements for being a member of a state or parish.
<b>living</b>	People who are still living. <i>A <b>living</b> language.</i>
<b>national</b>	Owned or maintained for the public by the national government. <i>The <b>national</b> government.</i>
<b>nationality</b>	An ethnic group forming a part of one or more political nations. <i>Men of Spanish <b>nationality</b>.</i>
<b>native</b>	Used in names of animals or plants resembling others familiar elsewhere e.g native bee. <i>The art of the <b>natives</b> of the northwest coast.</i>
<b>plebeian</b>	Of or belonging to the commoners of ancient Rome. <i>Two dancers one royal and one <b>plebeian</b>.</i>
<b>plebiscite</b>	The direct vote of all the members of an electorate on an important public question such as a change in the constitution. <i>The administration will hold a <b>plebiscite</b> for the approval of constitutional reforms.</i>
<b>populate</b>	Fill with inhabitants. <i><b>Populate</b> the forest with deer and wild boar for hunting.</i>
<b>population</b>	Each of three groups (designated I, II, and III) into which stars can be approximately divided on the basis of their manner of formation. <i>He deplored the <b>population</b> of colonies with convicted criminals.</i>
<b>referendum</b>	A legislative act is referred for final approval to a popular vote by the electorate.
<b>reside</b>	(of a quality) be present or inherent in something. <i>People who work in the city actually <b>reside</b> in neighbouring towns.</i>
<b>resident</b>	A guest in a hotel who stays for one or more nights. <i>An intangible computer program <b>resident</b> on a magnetic disk.</i>
<b>vote</b>	An act of giving or registering a vote. <i>They put the question to a <b>vote</b>.</i>

**voter** A citizen who has a legal right to vote.
