Clamp as a Noun

Definitions of "Clamp" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "clamp" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- A device (generally used by carpenters) that holds things firmly together.
- A brace, band, or clasp for strengthening or holding things together.
- An electric circuit which serves to maintain the voltage limits of a signal at prescribed levels.





Synonyms of "Clamp" as a noun (6 Words)

<u>brace</u>	A structural member used to stiffen a framework. A neck brace .
clinch	A struggle or scuffle at close quarters. We went into a passionate clinch on the sofa.
immobilizer	A device for immobilizing a motor vehicle in order to prevent theft.
press	Any machine that exerts pressure to form or shape or cut materials or extract liquids or compress solids. <i>At the pressing of a button.</i>
vice	A weakness of character or behaviour; a bad habit. A mobile phone network is being used to peddle vice .
wheel clamp	A wheeled vehicle that has two wheels and is moved by foot pedals.





Usage Examples of "Clamp" as a noun

• I have fixed the motor to the table with two clamps.







Clamp as a Verb

Definitions of "Clamp" as a verb

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "clamp" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Immobilize (an unlawfully parked car) by fixing a wheel clamp to one of its wheels.
- Maintain the voltage limits of (an electrical signal) at prescribed values.
- Impose or inflict forcefully.
- Fasten or fix with a clamp.
- Hold (something) tightly against another thing.
- Fasten (something) in place with a clamp.
- Fasten (two things) firmly together.





Synonyms of "Clamp" as a verb (12 Words)

attach	Cause to be attached. The Earl Marshal attach ed Gloucester for high treason.
<u>clench</u>	Grasp (something) tightly and firmly. <i>Her teeth clenched in anger.</i>
<u>clip</u>	Fasten or be fastened with a clip or clips. She clip ped on a pair of diamond earrings.
fasten	Become fixed or fastened. They fasten ed various nicknames to each other.
fix	Make fixed stable or stationary. Cowley fix ed him with a cold stare.
grip	To grip or seize as in a wrestling match. <i>He gripped the steering wheel.</i>
hold	Have room for hold without crowding. You can t hold yourself responsible for what happened.
immobilize	Prevent (something or someone) from moving or operating as normal. The car had been immobilize d by a wheel clamp.
make fast	Eliminate urine.
press	Exert pressure or force to or upon. This is a press ing problem.
<u>secure</u>	Make (a door or container) hard to open; fasten or lock. The government is concerned to secure the economy against too much foreign ownership.
<u>squeeze</u>	Squeeze or press together. <i>They</i> squeeze <i>d money from the owner of the business by threatening him.</i>





Usage Examples of "Clamp" as a verb

- Clamp the chair together until the glue has hardened.
- The military government clamped a curfew onto the capital.
- The sander is clamped on to the edge of a workbench.
- *Maggie had to clamp a hand over her mouth to stop herself from laughing.*
- The two frames are clamped together.
- He had flown into a rage when he found his car was clamped.
