## Clamp as a Noun

### Definitions of "Clamp" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “clamp” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A device (generally used by carpenters) that holds things firmly together.*
- *A brace, band, or clasp for strengthening or holding things together.*
- *An electric circuit which serves to maintain the voltage limits of a signal at prescribed levels.*



## Synonyms of "Clamp" as a noun (6 Words)

- brace** A structural member used to stiffen a framework.  
*A neck **brace**.*
- clinch** A struggle or scuffle at close quarters.  
*We went into a passionate **clinch** on the sofa.*
- immobilizer** A device for immobilizing a motor vehicle in order to prevent theft.
- press** Any machine that exerts pressure to form or shape or cut materials or extract liquids or compress solids.  
*At the **pressing** of a button.*
- vice** A weakness of character or behaviour; a bad habit.  
*A mobile phone network is being used to peddle **vice**.*
- wheel clamp** A wheeled vehicle that has two wheels and is moved by foot pedals.

- *I have fixed the motor to the table with two clamps.*



## Clamp as a Verb

### Definitions of "Clamp" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "clamp" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Immobilize (an unlawfully parked car) by fixing a wheel clamp to one of its wheels.*
- *Maintain the voltage limits of (an electrical signal) at prescribed values.*
- *Impose or inflict forcefully.*
- *Fasten or fix with a clamp.*
- *Hold (something) tightly against another thing.*
- *Fasten (something) in place with a clamp.*
- *Fasten (two things) firmly together.*



## Synonyms of "Clamp" as a verb (12 Words)

<b>attach</b>	Cause to be attached. <i>The Earl Marshal <b>attached</b> Gloucester for high treason.</i>
<b>clench</b>	Grasp (something) tightly and firmly. <i>Her teeth <b>clenched</b> in anger.</i>
<b>clip</b>	Fasten or be fastened with a clip or clips. <i>She <b>clipped</b> on a pair of diamond earrings.</i>
<b>fasten</b>	Become fixed or fastened. <i>They <b>fastened</b> various nicknames to each other.</i>
<b>fix</b>	Make fixed stable or stationary. <i>Cowley <b>fixed</b> him with a cold stare.</i>
<b>grip</b>	To grip or seize as in a wrestling match. <i>He <b>gripped</b> the steering wheel.</i>
<b>hold</b>	Have room for hold without crowding. <i>You can't <b>hold</b> yourself responsible for what happened.</i>
<b>immobilize</b>	Prevent (something or someone) from moving or operating as normal. <i>The car had been <b>immobilized</b> by a wheel clamp.</i>
<b>make fast</b>	Eliminate urine.
<b>press</b>	Exert pressure or force to or upon. <i>This is a <b>pressing</b> problem.</i>
<b>secure</b>	Make (a door or container) hard to open; fasten or lock. <i>The government is concerned to <b>secure</b> the economy against too much foreign ownership.</i>
<b>squeeze</b>	Squeeze or press together. <i>They <b>squeezed</b> money from the owner of the business by threatening him.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Clamp" as a verb

- *Clamp the chair together until the glue has hardened.*
- *The military government clamped a curfew onto the capital.*
- *The sander is clamped on to the edge of a workbench.*
- *Maggie had to clamp a hand over her mouth to stop herself from laughing.*
- *The two frames are clamped together.*
- *He had flown into a rage when he found his car was clamped.*
