| elucidation | An act of explaining that serves to clear up and cast light on. <i>Work that led to the elucidation of the structure of proteins.</i> |
| explanation | A statement that makes something comprehensible by describing the relevant structure or operation or circumstances etc. <i>Freud tried to make sex the explanation for everything.</i> |
| illumination | A condition of spiritual awareness divine illumination. <i>Higher levels of illumination are needed for reading.</i> |
| simplification | Elimination of superfluous details. <i>He is proposing simplification of the planning system.</i> |

- *The professor's clarification helped her to understand the textbook.*
- *Please advise us if you require further clarification.*

- *The remaining changes are small clarifications.*

| clarify | Melt (butter) in order to separate out the water and milk solids. <i>Clarify the butter.</i> |
| clear | A clear or unobstructed space or expanse of land or water. <i>A clear perfect diamond.</i> |
| clearing | A tract of land with few or no trees in the middle of a wooded area. |
| compaction | The act of crushing. <i>An ice core formed by compaction of previous snowfalls constitutes a historical record of the local climate.</i> |
| definition | The action or process of defining something. <i>Our definition of what constitutes poetry.</i> |
| depict | Represent by a drawing, painting, or other art form. <i>Youth is depicted as a time of vitality and good health.</i> |

| deposition | The action of depositing something. <i>Pebbles formed by the deposition of calcium in solution.</i> |
| descriptive | (of an adjective) assigning a quality rather than restricting the application of the expression modified, e.g. blue as distinct from few. <i>The text contains some good descriptive passages.</i> |
| elucidate | Make free from confusion or ambiguity; make clear. <i>In what follows I shall try to elucidate what I believe the problems to be.</i> |
| enlighten | Give spiritual insight to; in religion. <i>The sun enlightened some such clouds near him.</i> |
| excuse | Defend explain clear away or make excuses for by reasoning. <i>Excuse someone s behavior.</i> |
| expatiate | Add details, as to an account or idea; clarify the meaning of and discourse in a learned way, usually in writing. <i>She expatiated on working class novelists.</i> |
| explain | Serve as a reason or cause or justification of. <i>He explained the situation.</i> |
| explanation | Thought that makes something comprehensible. <i>The birth rate is central to any explanation of population trends.</i> |
| explicate | Analyse (a literary work) in order to reveal its meaning. <i>An attempt to explicate the relationship between crime and economic forces.</i> |
| explicit | Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. <i>She made her wishes explicit.</i> |
| expound | Add details, as to an account or idea; clarify the meaning of and discourse in a learned way, usually in writing. <i>He was expounding a powerful argument.</i> |
| facilitation | The enhancement of the response of a neuron to a stimulus following prior stimulation. <i>The response is dependent on the frequency of stimulation and on neuromuscular facilitation.</i> |
| hydrostatics | Study of the mechanical properties of fluids that are not in motion. |
| instructions | A manual usually accompanying a technical device and explaining how to install or operate it. |
| interpretation | An explanation of something that is not immediately obvious. <i>The report included his interpretation of the forensic evidence.</i> |
| pellucid | Translucently clear. <i>He writes as always in pellucid prose.</i> |

| perspicuity | Clarity as a consequence of being perspicuous. |
| perspicuous | Transparently clear; easily understandable- Robert Burton. <i>It provides simpler and more perspicuous explanations than its rivals.</i> |
| rationale | A set of reasons or a logical basis for a course of action or belief. <i>The rationale for capital punishment.</i> |
| sedimentation | The phenomenon of sediment or gravel accumulating. <i>Sedimentation occurs when the droplets sink to the bottom.</i> |
| signification | The representation or conveying of meaning. <i>The signification of Chinese characters.</i> |
| simplification | An explanation that omits superfluous details and reduces complexity. <i>He is proposing simplification of the planning system.</i> |
| stabilization | The process of making something physically more secure or stable. <i>Stabilization means that the product can be handled under atmospheric conditions.</i> |
