### Definitions of "Clarification" as a noun

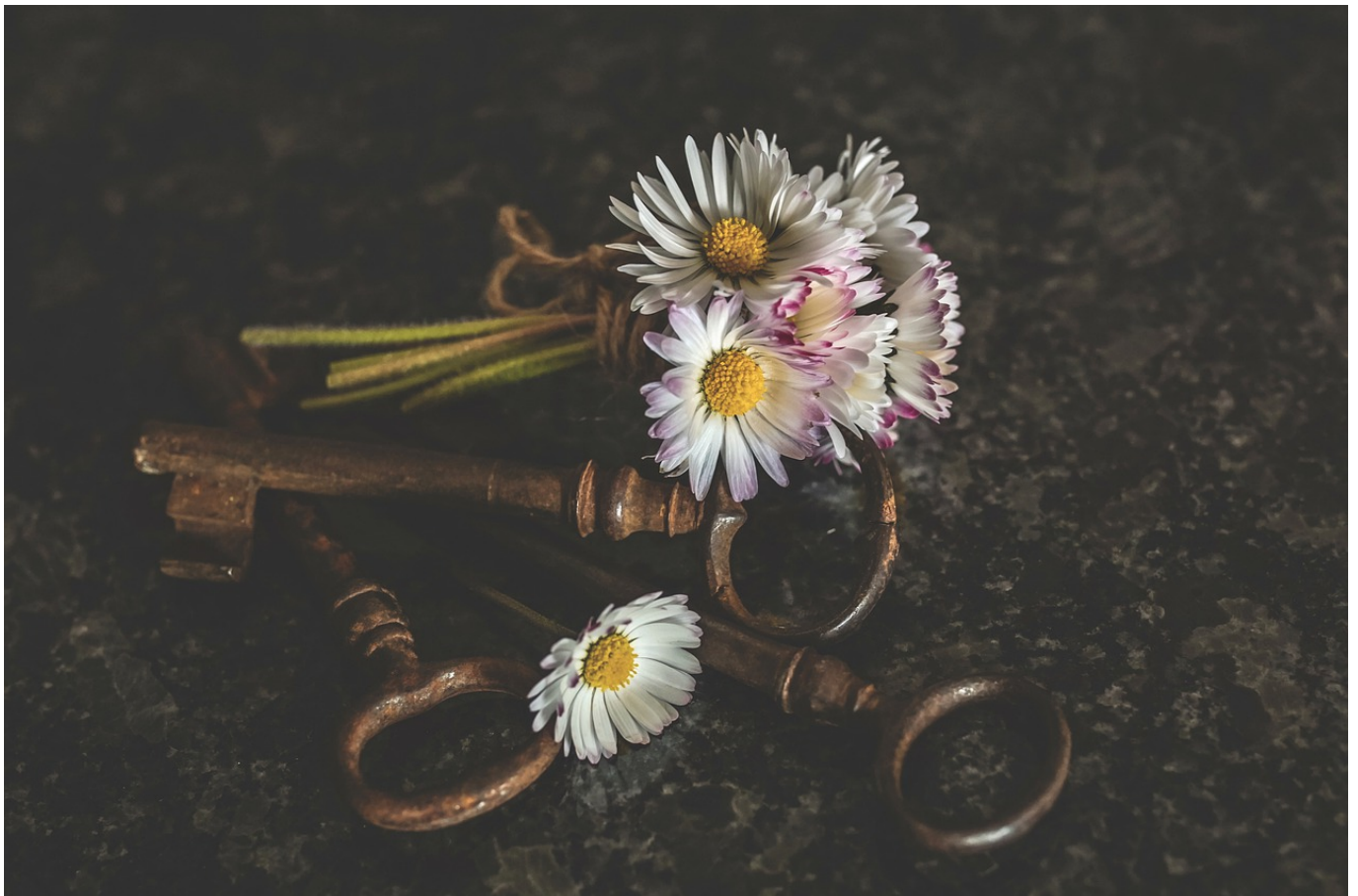
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “clarification” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The act of removing solid particles from a liquid.*
- *The action of making a statement or situation less confused and more comprehensible.*
- *An interpretation that removes obstacles to understanding.*



## Synonyms of "Clarification" as a noun (5 Words)

<b>clearing</b>	The act of removing solid particles from a liquid.
<b>elucidation</b>	An act of explaining that serves to clear up and cast light on. <i>Work that led to the <b>elucidation</b> of the structure of proteins.</i>
<b>explanation</b>	A statement that makes something comprehensible by describing the relevant structure or operation or circumstances etc. <i>Freud tried to make sex the <b>explanation</b> for everything.</i>
<b>illumination</b>	A condition of spiritual awareness divine illumination. <i>Higher levels of <b>illumination</b> are needed for reading.</i>
<b>simplification</b>	Elimination of superfluous details. <i>He is proposing <b>simplification</b> of the planning system.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Clarification" as a noun

- *The professor's clarification helped her to understand the textbook.*
- *Please advise us if you require further clarification.*

- *The remaining changes are small clarifications.*



## Associations of "Clarification" (30 Words)

<b>aeration</b>	The introduction of air into a material. <i>The <b>aeration</b> of the soil.</i>
<b>clarify</b>	Melt (butter) in order to separate out the water and milk solids. <i><b>Clarify</b> the butter.</i>
<b>clear</b>	A clear or unobstructed space or expanse of land or water. <i>A <b>clear</b> perfect diamond.</i>
<b>clearing</b>	A tract of land with few or no trees in the middle of a wooded area.
<b>compaction</b>	The act of crushing. <i>An ice core formed by <b>compaction</b> of previous snowfalls constitutes a historical record of the local climate.</i>
<b>definition</b>	The action or process of defining something. <i>Our <b>definition</b> of what constitutes poetry.</i>
<b>depict</b>	Represent by a drawing, painting, or other art form. <i>Youth is <b>depicted</b> as a time of vitality and good health.</i>



<b>deposition</b>	The action of depositing something. <i>Pebbles formed by the <b>deposition</b> of calcium in solution.</i>
<b>descriptive</b>	(of an adjective) assigning a quality rather than restricting the application of the expression modified, e.g. blue as distinct from few. <i>The text contains some good <b>descriptive</b> passages.</i>
<b>elucidate</b>	Make free from confusion or ambiguity; make clear. <i>In what follows I shall try to <b>elucidate</b> what I believe the problems to be.</i>
<b>enlighten</b>	Give spiritual insight to; in religion. <i>The sun <b>enlightened</b> some such clouds near him.</i>
<b>excuse</b>	Defend explain clear away or make excuses for by reasoning. <i><b>Excuse</b> someone s behavior.</i>
<b>expatiate</b>	Add details, as to an account or idea; clarify the meaning of and discourse in a learned way, usually in writing. <i>She <b>expatiated</b> on working class novelists.</i>
<b>explain</b>	Serve as a reason or cause or justification of. <i>He <b>explained</b> the situation.</i>
<b>explanation</b>	Thought that makes something comprehensible. <i>The birth rate is central to any <b>explanation</b> of population trends.</i>
<b>explicate</b>	Analyse (a literary work) in order to reveal its meaning. <i>An attempt to <b>explicate</b> the relationship between crime and economic forces.</i>
<b>explicit</b>	Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. <i>She made her wishes <b>explicit</b>.</i>
<b>expound</b>	Add details, as to an account or idea; clarify the meaning of and discourse in a learned way, usually in writing. <i>He was <b>expounding</b> a powerful argument.</i>
<b>facilitation</b>	The enhancement of the response of a neuron to a stimulus following prior stimulation. <i>The response is dependent on the frequency of stimulation and on neuromuscular <b>facilitation</b>.</i>
<b>hydrostatics</b>	Study of the mechanical properties of fluids that are not in motion.
<b>instructions</b>	A manual usually accompanying a technical device and explaining how to install or operate it.
<b>interpretation</b>	An explanation of something that is not immediately obvious. <i>The report included his <b>interpretation</b> of the forensic evidence.</i>
<b>pellucid</b>	Translucently clear. <i>He writes as always in <b>pellucid</b> prose.</i>

<b>perspicuity</b>	Clarity as a consequence of being perspicuous.
<b>perspicuous</b>	Transparently clear; easily understandable- Robert Burton. <i>It provides simpler and more <b>perspicuous</b> explanations than its rivals.</i>
<b>rationale</b>	A set of reasons or a logical basis for a course of action or belief. <i>The <b>rationale</b> for capital punishment.</i>
<b>sedimentation</b>	The phenomenon of sediment or gravel accumulating. <i><b>Sedimentation</b> occurs when the droplets sink to the bottom.</i>
<b>signification</b>	The representation or conveying of meaning. <i>The <b>signification</b> of Chinese characters.</i>
<b>simplification</b>	An explanation that omits superfluous details and reduces complexity. <i>He is proposing <b>simplification</b> of the planning system.</i>
<b>stabilization</b>	The process of making something physically more secure or stable. <i><b>Stabilization</b> means that the product can be handled under atmospheric conditions.</i>
