| candour | The quality of being open and honest; frankness. <i>A man of refreshing candour.</i> |
| clear | Clear from impurities blemishes pollution etc. <i>Clear a memory buffer.</i> |
| concise | Giving a lot of information clearly and in a few words; brief but comprehensive. <i>A concise explanation.</i> |
| conciseness | Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words. |
| directness | The quality of being honest and straightforward in attitude and speech. <i>He was renowned for the clarity and directness of his sermons.</i> |
| drawl | A slow speech pattern with prolonged vowels. <i>Suits me fine he drawled.</i> |
| ease | Of share prices interest rates etc decrease in value or amount. <i>She gave up smoking with ease.</i> |
| easiness | Freedom from difficulty or hardship or effort. <i>The easiness we feel when sleeping.</i> |

| forthrightness | The quality of being honest and straightforward in attitude and speech. |
| frank | A member of the ancient Germanic peoples who spread from the Rhine into the Roman Empire in the 4th century. <i>Frank ulceration.</i> |
| generality | An idea or conclusion having general application. <i>His service was better than that offered by the generality of doctors.</i> |
| <u>honesty</u> | A European plant with purple or white flowers and round, flat, translucent seed pods which are used for indoor flower arrangements. <i>I bought potatoes and tomatoes from the roadside stall putting 3 in the honesty box.</i> |
| laconic | Brief and to the point; effectively cut short. <i>The laconic reply yes.</i> |
| <u>mortality</u> | The quality or state of being mortal. <i>The causes of mortality among infants and young children.</i> |
| pithiness | Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words. |
| <u>pithy</u> | Concise and full of meaning. <i>Welcomed her pithy comments.</i> |
| simple | A medicinal herb, or a medicine made from one. <i>Simple mechanisms.</i> |
| simplicity | A lack of penetration or subtlety. <i>For the sake of simplicity this chapter will concentrate upon one theory.</i> |
| <u>sincerity</u> | The absence of pretence, deceit, or hypocrisy. <i>They demanded some proof of my sincerity.</i> |
| straightness | Having honest intentions. |
| succinctness | Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words. |
| <u>terse</u> | Brief and to the point; effectively cut short. <i>Short and terse and easy to understand.</i> |
| transience | An impermanence that suggests the inevitability of ending or dying. <i>The transience of life and happiness.</i> |
| <u>transient</u> | (physics) a short-lived oscillation in a system caused by a sudden change of voltage or current or load. <i>A transient cold spell.</i> |
| well | Often used as a combining form in a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well. <i>The currents well up.</i> |
