Definitions of "Classroom" as a noun

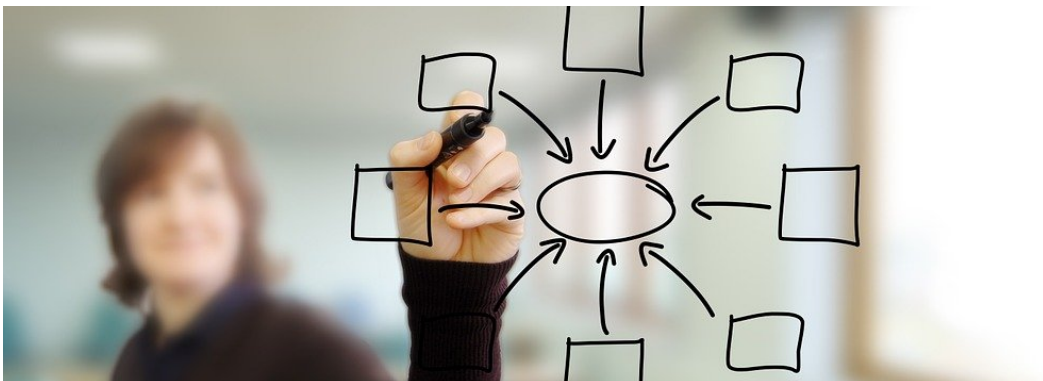
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “classroom” as a noun can have the following definitions:

academy	A society or institution of distinguished scholars and artists or scientists that aims to promote and maintain standards in its particular field. <i>A police academy.</i>
auditorium	The area of a theater or concert hall where the audience sits. <i>The National Indoor Arena is a magnificent auditorium and one of Britain's premier indoor venues.</i>
blackboard	Sheet of slate; for writing with chalk.
cafeteria	A restaurant in which customers serve themselves from a counter and pay before eating. <i>Employers who offer cafeteria plans and other flexible programs.</i>
campus	The grounds of a school, hospital, or other institution. <i>For the first year I had a room on campus.</i>
canteen	A recreation room in an institution.
chalk	A series of strata consisting mainly of chalk. <i>The menu was chalked up on a blackboard.</i>
college	The teaching staff and students of a college considered collectively. <i>The Oxford colleges.</i>
diploma	An official document or charter.
dorm	A dormitory.
dormitory	A large bedroom for a number of people in a school or institution. <i>He visited the boarders in their dormitory.</i>
educator	Someone who educates young people. <i>The perspective of a professional educator.</i>
extracurricular	Outside the normal routine, especially that provided by a job or marriage. <i>The extracurricular activities of a philandering husband.</i>
grad	One-hundredth of a right angle.
gymnasium	A room or building equipped for gymnastics, games, and other physical exercise.
homeroom	A classroom in which a group of students assembles daily with the same teacher before dispersing to other classes.
indoor	Relating to sports played indoors. <i>An indoor setting.</i>
instructor	A person who teaches something. <i>A driving instructor.</i>

<u>library</u>	A collection of books and periodicals held in a library. A library book.
matriculate	A person who has matriculated. <i>The arms have been matriculated by the Lord Lyon King of Arms in Edinburgh.</i>
pedagogics	The principles and methods of instruction.
pedagogy	The method and practice of teaching, especially as an academic subject or theoretical concept. <i>Pedagogy is recognized as an important profession.</i>
pupil	The contractile aperture in the center of the iris of the eye; resembles a large black dot. <i>Will you take me on as your pupil.</i>
<u>school</u>	A day s work at school. <i>I never took schools I was ill.</i>
schoolmaster	An experienced horse that is used to train or give confidence to inexperienced riders or horses.
teach	A teacher. <i>He came one day each week to teach painting.</i>
<u>teacher</u>	A person whose occupation is teaching. <i>A history teacher.</i>
<u>trainee</u>	Someone who is being trained. <i>Trainee solicitors.</i>
undergraduate	Denoting or relating to an undergraduate. <i>A group of Oxford undergraduates.</i>
<u>university</u>	The body of faculty and students at a university. <i>His daughter is at university.</i>
