According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “clause” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A particular and separate article, stipulation, or proviso in a treaty, bill, or contract.*
- *A separate section of a legal document (as a statute or contract or will.*
- *(grammar) an expression including a subject and predicate functioning as a part of a complex sentence.*
- *A unit of grammatical organization next below the sentence in rank and in traditional grammar said to consist of a subject and predicate.*
- *An expression including a subject and predicate but not constituting a complete sentence.*

A group of words that form a constituent of a sentence and are considered as a single unit.

*They reduced the price on many **items**.*

**locution**

A person's style of speech.

*His impeccable **locution**.*

**note**

A banknote.

*The fresh **note** of bergamot.*

<b>paragraph</b>	One of several distinct subdivisions of a text intended to separate ideas; the beginning is usually marked by a new indented line. <i>The information set out in <b>paragraph</b> 3.</i>
<b>part</b>	A melody or other constituent of harmony assigned to a particular voice or instrument in a musical work. <i>They analyzed the river into three <b>parts</b>.</i>
<u><b>passage</b></u>	A narrow way allowing access between buildings or to different rooms within a building a passageway. <i>He picked up the newspaper and read the <b>passage</b> again.</i>
<b>phrasal idiom</b>	The style of a particular artist or school or movement.
<b>phrasal verb</b>	A content word that denotes an action, occurrence, or state of existence.
<b>point</b>	The action or position of a dog in pointing. <i>From this <b>point</b> onwards the teacher was completely won over.</i>
<u><b>section</b></u>	One of several parts or pieces that fit with others to constitute a whole object. <i>The brass <b>section</b>.</i>
<b>set phrase</b>	A group of things of the same kind that belong together and are so used.
<u><b>subsection</b></u>	A division of a section. <i>Each chapter has a different theme and numerous <b>subsections</b>.</i>
<b>term</b>	A statement of what is required as part of an agreement. <i>Loans on favourable <b>terms</b>.</i>
<b>turn of phrase</b>	A division during which one team is on the offensive.
<b>word group</b>	A secret word or phrase known only to a restricted group.
<b>wording</b>	The manner in which something is expressed in words. <i>The standard form of <b>wording</b> for a consent letter.</i>

<b>grammatical</b>	Well formed; in accordance with the rules of the grammar of a language. <i>Spoke in <b>grammatical</b> sentences.</i>
<b>homograph</b>	Two words are homographs if they are spelled the same way but differ in meaning e g fair.
<b>indicative</b>	A verb in the indicative mood. <i><b>Indicative</b> mood.</i>
<b>infinitive</b>	The uninflected form of the verb. <i><b>Infinitive</b> clauses.</i>
<b>inflect</b>	Of a word or language undergo inflection. <i>All of these words <b>inflect</b> irregularly.</i>
<b>noun</b>	A word other than a pronoun used to identify any of a class of people places or things common noun or to name a particular one of these proper noun.
<b>paragraph</b>	Write about in a paragraph. <i>His style deploys a lack of conventional <b>paragraphing</b>.</i>
<b>participle</b>	A word formed from a verb e g going gone being been and used as an adjective e g working woman burnt toast or a noun e g good breeding In English participles are also used to make compound verb forms e g is going has been.
<b>phrase</b>	Divide music into phrases in a particular way especially in performance. <i>His favourite <b>phrase</b> is it s a pleasure.</i>
<b>predicate</b>	Logic what is predicated of the subject of a proposition the second term in a proposition is predicated of the first term by means of the copula. <i>The <b>predicate</b> dog is <b>predicated</b> of the subject Fido in the sentence Fido is a dog.</i>
<b>prefix</b>	Add something at the beginning as a prefix or introduction. <i>A preface is <b>prefixed</b> to the book.</i>
<b>pronoun</b>	A function word that is used in place of a noun or noun phrase.

<b><u>restricted</u></b>	Restricted in meaning as e g man in a tall man. <i>Western scientists had only <b>restricted</b> access to the site.</i>
<b>sentence</b>	Pronounce a sentence on somebody in a court of law. <i>His <b>sentence</b> was 5 to 10 years.</i>
<b><u>subordinate</u></b>	Make subordinate dependent or subservient. <i>A <b>subordinate</b> or dependent clause functions as a noun or adjective or adverb within a sentence.</i>
<b>suffix</b>	Attach a suffix to. <i><b>Suffix</b> words.</i>
<b><u>suggestive</u></b>	Tending to suggest an idea. <i>A <b>suggestive</b> remark.</i>
<b><u>tentative</u></b>	Done without confidence; hesitant. <i>A <b>tentative</b> conclusion.</i>
