## **Cleaner as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Cleaner" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “cleaner” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A shop where clothes and fabrics are dry-cleaned.*
- *Someone whose occupation is cleaning.*
- *A device for cleaning, such as a vacuum cleaner.*
- *A person employed to clean the interior of a building.*
- *A preparation used in cleaning something.*
- *The operator of dry-cleaning establishment.*
- *A chemical substance used for cleaning.*



## Synonyms of "Cleaner" as a noun (4 Words)

**attendant** An event or situation that happens at the same time as or in connection with another.

*A cloakroom **attendant**.*

**cleanser** A substance that cleanses something, especially a cosmetic product for cleansing the skin.

*A skin **cleanser**.*

**dry cleaner** A reformer who opposes the use of intoxicating beverages.

**retainer** A fee paid in advance to someone, especially a barrister, in order to secure their services for use when required.

*He s on a **retainer** as a consultant.*

## Associations of "Cleaner" (30 Words)

<b>allegiant</b>	A person who owes or gives allegiance; a loyal follower or adherent (of someone or something). <i>It is impossible to be <b>allegiant</b> to two opposing forces.</i>
<b>bathtub</b>	A bath.
<b>broom</b>	Finish with a broom.
<b>brush</b>	The act of brushing your hair. <i>A <b>brush</b> with death.</i>
<b>brushing</b>	The act of brushing your teeth.
<b>butler</b>	The chief manservant of a house.
<b>clean</b>	Remove while making clean. <i><b>Clean</b> up before you see your grandparents.</i>

<b>cleaning</b>	The act of making something clean. <i>The housekeeper will help with the <b>cleaning</b>.</i>
<b>dirt</b>	A substance, such as mud or dust, that soils someone or something. <i>A <b>dirt</b> road.</i>
<b>dust</b>	Remove the dust from. <i><b>Dust</b> the bread with flour.</i>
<b>dutiful</b>	Willingly obedient out of a sense of duty and respect. <i>A <b>dutiful</b> child.</i>
<b>enslave</b>	Make (someone) a slave. <i>They were <b>enslaved</b> by their need to take drugs.</i>
<b>factotum</b>	An employee who does all kinds of work. <i>He was employed as the general <b>factotum</b>.</i>
<b>footman</b>	A man employed as a servant in a large establishment (as a palace) to run errands and do chores.
<b>housekeeper</b>	A servant who is employed to perform domestic task in a household.
<b>housekeeping</b>	The work of cleaning and running a house. <i>I took care of the <b>housekeeping</b> and cooked most of the meals.</i>
<b>janitor</b>	Someone employed to clean and maintain a building.
<b>laundress</b>	A working woman who takes in washing.
<b>lave</b>	Wash or flow against. <i>The sea below <b>laved</b> the shore with small agitated waves.</i>
<b>maid</b>	A virgin. <i>Mary eventually managed to find a job as a <b>maid</b>.</i>
<b>minion</b>	A follower or underling of a powerful person, especially a servile or unimportant one. <i>He gets oppressed <b>minions</b> like me to fob them off.</i>
<b>sanitation</b>	The state of being clean and conducive to health. <i>They could afford to erect new dwellings with a reasonable standard of construction and <b>sanitation</b>.</i>
<b>scrub</b>	An act of scrubbing something or someone. <i>The band <b>scrub</b> up well to play weddings and parties.</i>
<b>servant</b>	A person who performs duties for others, especially a person employed in a house on domestic duties or as a personal attendant. <i>He was a great <b>servant</b> of the Labour Party.</i>
<b>steward</b>	A person responsible for supplies of food to a college, club, or other institution. <i>The event was organized and <b>stewarded</b> properly.</i>

- sweep** Clean by sweeping.  
*The police finished their **sweep** through the woods.*
- sweeping** Dirt or refuse collected by sweeping.  
***Sweeping** generalizations.*
- vacuum** Clean with a vacuum cleaner.  
*The room needs to be **vacuumed**.*
- wash** An act of washing something or an instance of being washed.  
*The **wash** of a motorboat.*
- washing** The action of washing oneself or laundering clothes bed linen etc.  
*Avoid over enthusiastic **washing**.*
