clean	Ritually clean or pure. <i>Cats are clean animals.</i>
cleaner	A device for cleaning such as a vacuum cleaner. <i>My suit s at the cleaners.</i>
cleaning	The action of making something clean, especially the inside of a house. <i>The housekeeper will help with the cleaning.</i>
cleanly	In a manner that minimizes dirt and pollution. <i>He bounced it cleanly off the wall.</i>
cleanser	Rid of something unpleasant or defiling. <i>This preparation will cleanser and tighten the skin.</i>
clothing	Clothes collectively. <i>Bring warm clothing and waterproofs.</i>
detergent	Any additive with a similar action to a detergent e g an oil soluble substance which holds dirt in suspension in lubricating oil. <i>Liquid detergents.</i>
disinfect	Clean (something), especially with a chemical, in order to destroy bacteria. <i>Chlorine has been used to disinfect water in pools for many years.</i>

disinfection	The process of cleaning something, especially with a chemical, in order to destroy bacteria. <i>Instruments must undergo high level disinfection before reuse.</i>
fabric	Cloth or other material produced by weaving or knitting fibres. <i>We heard creaking and rushing noises in the car s fabric.</i>
hygienic	Tending to promote or preserve health. <i>Hygienic habits like using disposable tissues.</i>
laundry	Workplace where clothes are washed and ironed. <i>She went outside to hang some laundry on the line.</i>
neat	Tending to disregard specifics for the sake of convenience; facile. <i>Took his whiskey neat.</i>
neatly	In a neat way. <i>Neatly folded shirts.</i>
sanitary	Hygienic and clean. <i>A sanitary washroom.</i>
sanitation	Making something sanitary (free of germs) as by sterilizing. <i>They could afford to erect new dwellings with a reasonable standard of construction and sanitation.</i>
service	Perform a service or services for someone. <i>Service my truck.</i>
shampoo	The act of washing your hair with shampoo. <i>Dolly was sitting in the bath shampooing her hair.</i>
unstained	Not having a coating of stain or varnish. <i>An apron keeps his clothing unstained.</i>
vacuum	A vacuum cleaner. <i>The political vacuum left by the death of the Emperor.</i>
wash	An act of washing something or an instance of being washed. <i>I need someone to cook and wash for me.</i>
washing	The action of washing oneself or laundering clothes bed linen etc. <i>She took her washing around to the launderette.</i>
