- Free from contact or proximity or connection.
- Clear and distinct to the senses; easily perceptible.
- Accurately stated or described.
- Easily deciphered.
- Free from clouds or mist or haze.
- Readily apparent to the mind.
- Free of restrictions or qualifications.
- Affording free passage or view.
- Free from flaw or blemish or impurity.
- Freed from any question of guilt.
- Free from anything that dulls or dims.
- *Allowing light to pass through.*
- Characterized by ease and quickness in perceiving.
- Free from any encumbrance or limitation that presents a question of fact or law.
- Rid of objects or obstructions such as e.g. trees and brush.
