

• A trite or obvious remark.






Synonyms of "Cliche" as a noun (4 Words)

banality	The fact or condition of being banal; unoriginality. There is an essential banality to the story he tells.
bromide	A reproduction or piece of typesetting on bromide paper. <i>Feel good bromides create the illusion of problem solving.</i>
commonplace	A notable passage in a work copied into a commonplace book. Bombing has become almost a commonplace of public life there.
<u>platitude</u>	A trite or obvious remark. She began uttering liberal platitude s.





Associations of "Cliche" (30 Words)

<u>banal</u>	So lacking in originality as to be obvious and boring. Songs with banal repeated words.
banality	The fact or condition of being banal; unoriginality. There is an essential banality to the story he tells.
<u>bland</u>	Lacking stimulating characteristics; uninteresting. Standardized bland beers of mediocre quality.
boring	So lacking in interest as to cause mental weariness. I ve got a boring job in an office.
bromide	A reproduction or piece of typesetting on bromide paper. <i>Feel good bromides create the illusion of problem solving.</i>
commonplace	A notable passage in a work copied into a commonplace book. <i>Commonplace</i> everyday activities.



conventional	Based on or in accordance with what is generally done or believed. <i>Conventional</i> wisdom.
dull	Make dull in appearance. How dull and dreary the world is.
featureless	Lacking distinctive attributes or aspects. The featureless landscape of the steppe.
hackneyed	Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse. <i>Hackneyed</i> old sayings.
humdrum	Not challenging; dull and lacking excitement. <i>Humdrum</i> routine work.
insipid	Lacking flavour; weak or tasteless. <i>Insipid</i> hospital food.
<u>lackluster</u>	Lacking luster or shine. Staring with lackluster eyes.
median	Denoting the middle term or mean of the middle two terms of a series arranged in order of magnitude For example the median number of the series 55 62 76 85 93 is 76. <i>The median</i> part of the sternum.
mediocrity	The quality or state of being mediocre. The team suddenly came good after years of mediocrity .
<u>monotony</u>	Constancy of tone or pitch or inflection. Depression flattens the voice almost to monotony .
nondescript	A nondescript person or thing. The nondescript s were straight out of the nine to five banking bureaucracy.
normal	Conforming with or constituting a norm or standard or level or type or social norm not abnormal. Of normal intelligence.
ordinary	With no special or distinctive features; normal. Their clich s were vested with enough emotion to elevate them above the ordinary .
<u>platitude</u>	A remark or statement, especially one with a moral content, that has been used too often to be interesting or thoughtful. <i>She began uttering liberal platitudes.</i>
ponderous	Slow and clumsy because of great weight. Ponderous weapons.
shopworn	Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse. Shopworn merchandise at half price.



<u>simplistic</u>	Characterized by extreme and often misleading simplicity. <i>Simplistic</i> solutions.
stereotyped	Viewed or represented as a stereotype. Stereotyped phrases of condolence.
timeworn	Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse. Parroting some timeworn axiom.
<u>trite</u>	(of a remark or idea) lacking originality or freshness; dull on account of overuse. His remarks were trite and commonplace.
unexceptional	Not special in any way. An unexceptional movie.
<u>unremarkable</u>	Found in the ordinary course of events- Anita Diamant. His early childhood was unremarkable .
<u>usual</u>	Habitually or typically occurring or done; customary. <i>Their room was a shambles as usual.</i>
<u>vapid</u>	Lacking significance or liveliness or spirit or zest. A bunch of vapid schoolgirls.
