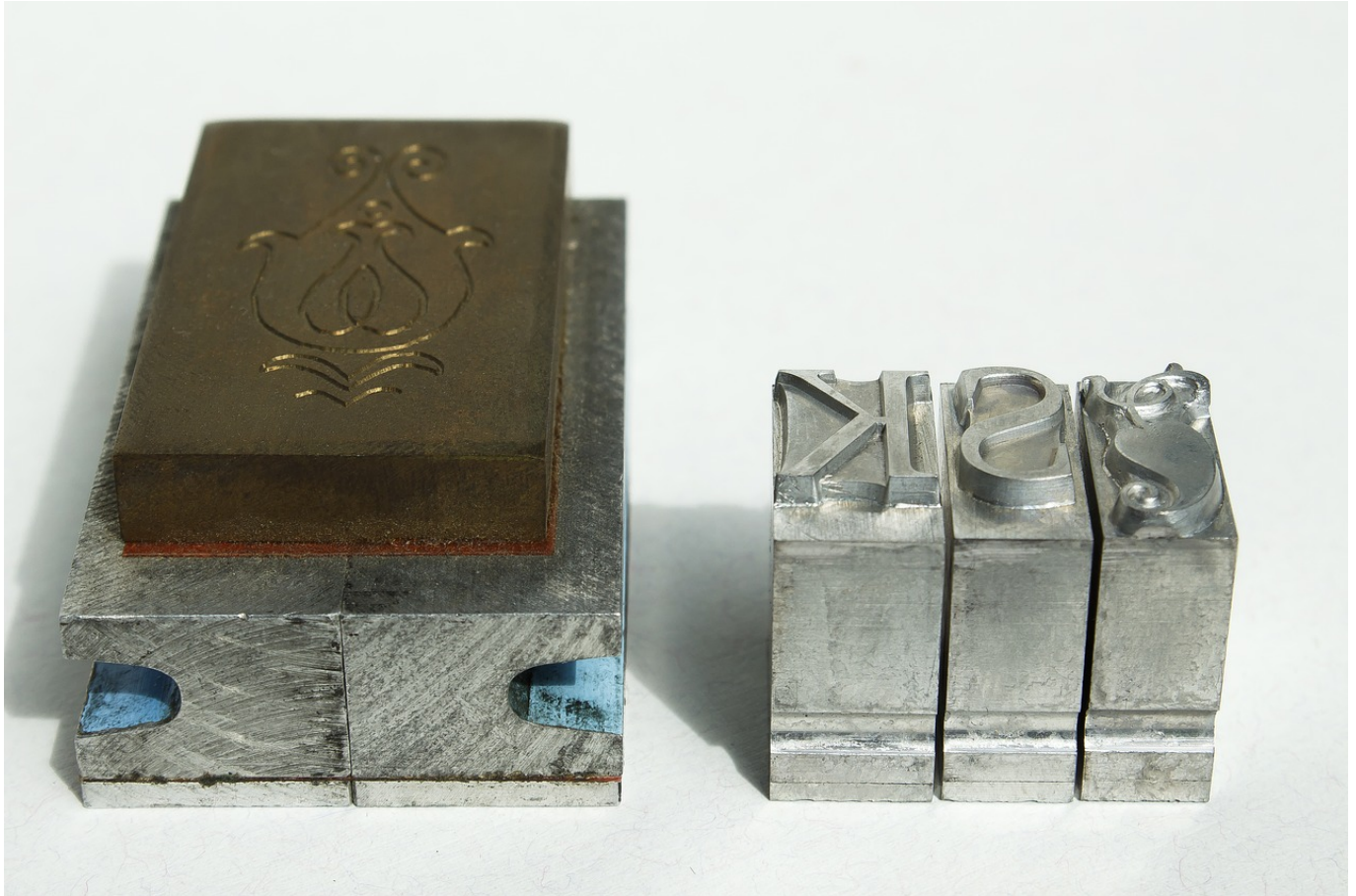

### **banal**

So lacking in originality as to be obvious and boring.  
*Songs with **banal** repeated words.*

### **banality**

The fact or condition of being banal; unoriginality.  
*There is an essential **banality** to the story he tells.*

### **bland**

Lacking stimulating characteristics; uninteresting.  
*Standardized **bland** beers of mediocre quality.*

### **boring**

So lacking in interest as to cause mental weariness.  
*I've got a **boring** job in an office.*

### **bromide**

A reproduction or piece of typesetting on bromide paper.  
*Feel good **bromides** create the illusion of problem solving.*

### **commonplace**

A notable passage in a work copied into a commonplace book.  
***Commonplace** everyday activities.*

<b>conventional</b>	Based on or in accordance with what is generally done or believed. <b>Conventional</b> wisdom.
<b>dull</b>	Make dull in appearance. How <b>dull</b> and dreary the world is.
<b>featureless</b>	Lacking distinctive attributes or aspects. The <b>featureless</b> landscape of the steppe.
<b>hackneyed</b>	Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse. <b>Hackneyed</b> old sayings.
<b>humdrum</b>	Not challenging; dull and lacking excitement. <b>Humdrum</b> routine work.
<b>insipid</b>	Lacking flavour; weak or tasteless. <b>Inspid</b> hospital food.
<b>lackluster</b>	Lacking luster or shine. Staring with <b>lackluster</b> eyes.
<b>median</b>	Denoting the middle term or mean of the middle two terms of a series arranged in order of magnitude For example the median number of the series 55 62 76 85 93 is 76. The <b>median</b> part of the sternum.
<b>mediocrity</b>	The quality or state of being mediocre. The team suddenly came good after years of <b>mediocrity</b> .
<b>monotony</b>	Constancy of tone or pitch or inflection. Depression flattens the voice almost to <b>monotony</b> .
<b>nondescript</b>	A nondescript person or thing. The <b>nondescripts</b> were straight out of the nine to five banking bureaucracy.
<b>normal</b>	Conforming with or constituting a norm or standard or level or type or social norm not abnormal. Of <b>normal</b> intelligence.
<b>ordinary</b>	With no special or distinctive features; normal. Their clichés were vested with enough emotion to elevate them above the <b>ordinary</b> .
<b>platitude</b>	A remark or statement, especially one with a moral content, that has been used too often to be interesting or thoughtful. She began uttering liberal <b>platitudes</b> .
<b>ponderous</b>	Slow and clumsy because of great weight. <b>Ponderous</b> weapons.
<b>shopworn</b>	Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse. <b>Shopworn</b> merchandise at half price.

<b><u>simplistic</u></b>	Characterized by extreme and often misleading simplicity. <b><i>Simplistic</i></b> solutions.
<b>stereotyped</b>	Viewed or represented as a stereotype. <b><i>Stereotyped</i></b> phrases of condolence.
<b>timeworn</b>	Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse. <i>Parroting some <b>timeworn</b> axiom.</i>
<b><u>trite</u></b>	(of a remark or idea) lacking originality or freshness; dull on account of overuse. <i>His remarks were <b>trite</b> and commonplace.</i>
<b>unexceptional</b>	Not special in any way. <i>An <b>unexceptional</b> movie.</i>
<b><u>unremarkable</u></b>	Found in the ordinary course of events- Anita Diamant. <i>His early childhood was <b>unremarkable</b>.</i>
<b><u>usual</u></b>	Habitually or typically occurring or done; customary. <i>Their room was a shambles as <b>usual</b>.</i>
<b><u>vapid</u></b>	Lacking significance or liveliness or spirit or zest. <i>A bunch of <b>vapid</b> schoolgirls.</i>
