## Associations of "Clientele" (30 Words)

**ask**

Require or ask for as a price or condition.

*The kidnappers are **asking** a million dollars in return for the release of their hostage.*

**attorney**

A solicitor.

**barrister**

A British or Canadian lawyer who speaks in the higher courts of law on behalf of either the defense or prosecution.

**booking**

An act of reserving accommodation, a ticket, etc. in advance.

*Wondered who had made the **booking**.*

<b>buyout</b>	The purchase of a controlling share in a company.
<b>chore</b>	A routine task, especially a household one. <i>The early risers were up and about doing their <b>chores</b>.</i>
<b>client</b>	Someone who pays for goods or services. <i>A <b>client</b> referred for counselling.</i>
<b>contracted</b>	Reduced in size or pulled together. <i>The <b>contracted</b> pupils of her eyes.</i>
<b>customer</b>	A person who buys goods or services from a shop or business. <i>Mr Harrison was a regular <b>customer</b> at the Golden Lion.</i>
<b>errand</b>	The purpose or object of an errand. <i>She asked Tim to run an <b>errand</b> for her.</i>
<b>freelancer</b>	A person who works freelance.
<b>guest</b>	A person staying at a hotel or guest house. <i>A regular <b>guest</b> on the morning show.</i>
<b>host</b>	Be the host of or for. <i>Your <b>host</b> is Stuart Macmillan.</i>
<b>invite</b>	Invite someone to one's house. <i>We <b>invited</b> the neighbors in for a cup of coffee.</i>
<b>lawyer</b>	Practise law work as a lawyer. <i>There is always a danger that the deal will be <b>lawyered</b> to death.</i>
<b>milkman</b>	Someone who delivers milk.
<b>offer</b>	Present or proffer something for someone to accept or reject as desired. <i>He had accepted Mallory's <b>offer</b> to buy him a drink.</i>
<b>patronage</b>	The power to control appointments to office or the right to privileges. <i>The direct train link was ending because of poor <b>patronage</b>.</i>
<b>pawnbroker</b>	A person who lends money at interest on the security of an article pawned.
<b>personnel</b>	The department responsible for hiring and training and placing employees and for setting policies for personnel management. <i>Sales <b>personnel</b>.</i>
<b>proprietorship</b>	An unincorporated business owned by a single person who is responsible for its liabilities and entitled to its profits. <i>The company was established in 1912 and is still under the <b>proprietorship</b> of the same family.</i>
<b>reception</b>	The first class in an infant or primary school. <i>Sensation is not the passive <b>reception</b> of stimuli.</i>
<b>requisition</b>	An official form on which a request is made. <i>I had to make various <b>requisitions</b> for staff and accommodation.</i>

<b>reservation</b>	<p>The act of reserving (a place or passage) or engaging the services of (a person or group).</p> <p><i>The retention of a right to enter the demised property will be a <b>reservation</b>.</i></p>
<b>service</b>	<p>Perform a service or services for someone.</p> <p><i><b>Service</b> is included in the final bill.</i></p>
<b>solicitor</b>	<p>A member of the legal profession qualified to deal with conveyancing the drawing up of wills and other legal matters A solicitor may also instruct barristers and represent clients in some courts.</p> <p><i>She had been a telephone <b>solicitor</b> for a Chicago newspaper.</i></p>
<a href="#"><u>sponsor</u></a>	<p>Assume sponsorship of.</p> <p><i>Joe is being <b>sponsored</b> by a government training scheme.</i></p>
<b>storekeeper</b>	<p>A shopkeeper.</p>
<b>visiting</b>	<p>(of an academic) working for a fixed period of time at another institution.</p> <p><i>A <b>visiting</b> speaker.</i></p>
<b>welcome</b>	<p>Bid welcome to greet upon arrival.</p> <p><i>Don't outstay your <b>welcome</b>.</i></p>
