A part of a structure having some specific characteristic or function.

The envelope of gases surrounding the earth or another planet.

*There was an **atmosphere** of excitement.*

### **attitude**

A complex mental state involving beliefs and feelings and values and dispositions to act in certain ways.

*He had the **attitude** that work was fun.*

The distinctive atmosphere or quality that seems to surround and be generated by a person, thing, or place.

*Muddy colours in the **aura** indicate negative emotions.*

### **clime**

A region considered with reference to its climate.

*Plants from a cold **clime** travel best in winter.*

<b>essence</b>	Any substance possessing to a high degree the predominant properties of a plant or drug or other natural product from which it is extracted. <i>Vanilla <b>essence</b>.</i>
<b>ethos</b>	The distinctive spirit of a culture or an era. <i>A challenge to the <b>ethos</b> of the 1960s.</i>
<b>feel</b>	Feelings of heightened emotion. <i>I cry at everything even the types of movies you wouldn't expect to give you all the <b>feels</b>.</i>
<b>feeling</b>	A sensitivity to or intuitive understanding of. <i>He had terrible <b>feelings</b> of guilt.</i>
<b>milieu</b>	The environmental condition. <i>Gregory came from the same aristocratic <b>milieu</b> as Sidonius.</i>
<b>mood</b>	(especially of music) inducing or suggestive of a particular feeling or state of mind. <i>He was obviously in a <b>mood</b>.</i>
<b>place</b>	A vacancy or available position. <i>Calculate the ratios to one decimal <b>place</b>.</i>
<b>region</b>	The approximate amount of something usually used prepositionally as in in the region of. <i><b>Regions</b> of outer space.</i>
<b>spirit</b>	The Holy Spirit. <i>A priest performed a rite of exorcism and the wandering <b>spirit</b> was ousted.</i>
<b>temper</b>	An angry state of mind. <i>He rushed out in a very bad <b>temper</b>.</i>
<b>tendency</b>	A group within a larger political party or movement. <i>A <b>tendency</b> to be too strict.</i>
<b>tenor</b>	An adult male with a tenor voice. <i>A <b>tenor</b> sax.</i>
<b>weather</b>	Denoting the side from which the wind is blowing, especially on board a ship; windward. <i>The <b>weather</b> side of the yacht.</i>
<b>weather conditions</b>	The atmospheric conditions that comprise the state of the atmosphere in terms of temperature and wind and clouds and precipitation.
<b>weather pattern</b>	The atmospheric conditions that comprise the state of the atmosphere in terms of temperature and wind and clouds and precipitation.

**zone**

A well-defined region extending round the earth between definite limits, especially between two parallels of latitude.

*A pedestrian **zone**.*

<b><u>damp</u></b>	Damp air or atmosphere. <i>A <b>damped</b> suspension that isolates the chassis from external vibration.</i>
<b>dampness</b>	A slight wetness. <i>The <b>dampness</b> in the air.</i>
<b><u>dry</u></b>	Remove the moisture from and make dry. <i>A very <b>dry</b> martini is almost straight gin.</i>
<b><u>dusty</u></b>	Covered with a layer of dust. <i>A <b>dusty</b> pile of books.</i>
<b>heater</b>	A gun. <i>A gas water <b>heater</b>.</i>
<b><u>humid</u></b>	Marked by a relatively high level of water vapour in the atmosphere. <i><b>Humid</b> weather.</i>

<b>humidity</b>	The state or quality of being humid. <i>The <b>humidity</b> should be supplied by regularly spraying the leaves.</i>
<b>jungle</b>	A wild tangled mass of vegetation or other things. <i>The lakes are hidden in dense <b>jungle</b>.</i>
<b>lowering</b>	The act of causing to become less. <i>Several objections to the <b>lowering</b> of the minimum age to 18 had been heard.</i>
<b>moisture</b>	Water or other liquid diffused in a small quantity as vapour, within a solid, or condensed on a surface. <i>The air was constantly heavy with <b>moisture</b>.</i>
<b>monsoon</b>	A seasonal prevailing wind in the region of South and SE Asia blowing from the south west between May and September and bringing rain the wet monsoon or from the north east between October and April the dry monsoon.
<b>muggy</b>	(of the weather) unpleasantly warm and humid. <i><b>Muggy</b> weather.</i>
<b>newscaster</b>	Someone who broadcasts the news.
<b>precipitation</b>	The quantity of water falling to earth at a specific place within a specified period of time. <i>The heavy post monsoon <b>precipitations</b>.</i>
<b>rain</b>	Falls of rain. <i>The <b>rain</b> had not stopped for days.</i>
<b>rainfall</b>	Water falling in drops from vapor condensed in the atmosphere. <i>Wildebeest sense distant <b>rainfall</b>.</i>
<b>rainy</b>	(of weather, a period, or an area) having or characterized by considerable rainfall. <i><b>Rainy</b> days.</i>
<b>seasonal</b>	Relating to or characteristic of a particular season of the year. <i><b>Seasonal</b> rainfall.</i>
<b>semiarid</b>	Somewhat arid. <i>A <b>semiarid</b> region with little annual rainfall.</i>
<b>snow</b>	Falls of snow. <i>We were trudging through deep <b>snow</b>.</i>
<b>summer</b>	Pasture cattle for the summer. <i>This plant flowers in late <b>summer</b>.</i>
<b>tropical</b>	Of or involving a trope; figurative. <i>A <b>tropical</b> rainforest.</i>

- tropics** The part of the Earth's surface between the Tropic of Cancer and the Tropic of Capricorn; characterized by a hot climate.
- vapor** The process of becoming a vapor.
- variability** Lack of consistency or fixed pattern; liability to vary or change.  
*A great deal of **variability** in quality.*
- warmer** A device for warming something; a thing that warms.  
*Winter **warmers** like steamed syrup sponge.*
- weather** Change under the action or influence of the weather.  
*The **weather** side of the yacht.*
- weatherman** Predicts the weather.
- wet** Cause to become wet.  
*A **wet** canteen.*
- winter** The coldest season of the year in the northern hemisphere it extends from the winter solstice to the vernal equinox.  
*Shackleton s men over**wintered** on Elephant Island.*
