A particular environment or surrounding influence.

*The relaxed **ambience** of the cocktail lounge is popular with guests.*

area

A part of a structure having some specific characteristic or function.

*The dining **area**.*

atmosphere

The envelope of gases surrounding the earth or another planet.

*There was an **atmosphere** of excitement.*

attitude

A complex mental state involving beliefs and feelings and values and dispositions to act in certain ways.

*He had the **attitude** that work was fun.*

The distinctive atmosphere or quality that seems to surround and be generated by a person, thing, or place.

*Muddy colours in the **aura** indicate negative emotions.*

clime

A region considered with reference to its climate.

*Plants from a cold **clime** travel best in winter.*

<u>country</u>	The people who live in a nation or country. A country lane.
essence	Any substance possessing to a high degree the predominant properties of a plant or drug or other natural product from which it is extracted. Vanilla essence .
<u>ethos</u>	The distinctive spirit of a culture or an era. A challenge to the ethos of the 1960s.
feel	Feelings of heightened emotion. <i>I cry at everything even the types of movies you wouldn't expect to give you all the feels.</i>
feeling	A sensitivity to or intuitive understanding of. <i>He had terrible feelings of guilt.</i>
<u>milieu</u>	The environmental condition. <i>Gregory came from the same aristocratic milieu as Sidonius.</i>
mood	(especially of music) inducing or suggestive of a particular feeling or state of mind. <i>He was obviously in a mood.</i>
place	A vacancy or available position. <i>Calculate the ratios to one decimal place.</i>
<u>region</u>	The approximate amount of something usually used prepositionally as in in the region of. Regions of outer space.
spirit	The Holy Spirit. <i>A priest performed a rite of exorcism and the wandering spirit was ousted.</i>
<u>temper</u>	An angry state of mind. <i>He rushed out in a very bad temper.</i>
<u>tendency</u>	A group within a larger political party or movement. A tendency to be too strict.
<u>tenor</u>	An adult male with a tenor voice. A tenor sax.
<u>weather</u>	Denoting the side from which the wind is blowing, especially on board a ship; windward. <i>The weather side of the yacht.</i>
weather conditions	The atmospheric conditions that comprise the state of the atmosphere in terms of temperature and wind and clouds and precipitation.
weather pattern	The atmospheric conditions that comprise the state of the atmosphere in terms of temperature and wind and clouds and precipitation.

zone

A well-defined region extending round the earth between definite limits, especially between two parallels of latitude.

A *pedestrian zone*.

damp

Damp air or atmosphere.

A **damped** suspension that isolates the chassis from external vibration.

dampness

A slight wetness.

The **dampness** in the air.

dry

Remove the moisture from and make dry.

A very **dry** martini is almost straight gin.

dusty

Covered with a layer of dust.

A **dusty** pile of books.

heater

A gun.

A gas water **heater**.

humid

Marked by a relatively high level of water vapour in the atmosphere.

Humid weather.

humidity	The state or quality of being humid. <i>The humidity should be supplied by regularly spraying the leaves.</i>
jungle	A wild tangled mass of vegetation or other things. <i>The lakes are hidden in dense jungle.</i>
lowering	The act of causing to become less. <i>Several objections to the lowering of the minimum age to 18 had been heard.</i>
moisture	Water or other liquid diffused in a small quantity as vapour, within a solid, or condensed on a surface. <i>The air was constantly heavy with moisture.</i>
monsoon	A seasonal prevailing wind in the region of South and SE Asia blowing from the south west between May and September and bringing rain the wet monsoon or from the north east between October and April the dry monsoon.
muggy	(of the weather) unpleasantly warm and humid. <i>Muggy weather.</i>
newscaster	Someone who broadcasts the news.
precipitation	The quantity of water falling to earth at a specific place within a specified period of time. <i>The heavy post monsoon precipitations.</i>
rain	Falls of rain. <i>The rain had not stopped for days.</i>
rainfall	Water falling in drops from vapor condensed in the atmosphere. <i>Wildebeest sense distant rainfall.</i>
rainy	(of weather, a period, or an area) having or characterized by considerable rainfall. <i>Rainy days.</i>
seasonal	Relating to or characteristic of a particular season of the year. <i>Seasonal rainfall.</i>
semiarid	Somewhat arid. <i>A semiarid region with little annual rainfall.</i>
snow	Falls of snow. <i>We were trudging through deep snow.</i>
summer	Pasture cattle for the summer. <i>This plant flowers in late summer.</i>
tropical	Of or involving a trope; figurative. <i>A tropical rainforest.</i>

tropics	The part of the Earth's surface between the Tropic of Cancer and the Tropic of Capricorn; characterized by a hot climate.
vapor	The process of becoming a vapor.
<u>variability</u>	Lack of consistency or fixed pattern; liability to vary or change. <i>A great deal of variability in quality.</i>
warmer	A device for warming something; a thing that warms. <i>Winter warmers like steamed syrup sponge.</i>
<u>weather</u>	Change under the action or influence of the weather. <i>The weather side of the yacht.</i>
weatherman	Predicts the weather.
<u>wet</u>	Cause to become wet. <i>A wet canteen.</i>
<u>winter</u>	The coldest season of the year in the northern hemisphere it extends from the winter solstice to the vernal equinox. <i>Shackleton's men overwintered on Elephant Island.</i>
