alpine	Relating to high mountains. <i>Alpine flowers.</i>
ascend	Appear to be moving upward, as by means of tendrils. <i>The mountaineers slowly</i> ascend ed the steep slope.
ascending	The act of changing location in an upward direction. A gently ascending forest path.
ascent	A movement upward. The first ascent of the Matterhorn.
