## Associations of "Clingy" (30 Words)

<b>accretion</b>	Growth or increase by the gradual accumulation of additional layers or matter. <i>He scraped away the <b>accretions</b> of paint.</i>
<b>acutely</b>	In a shrewd manner. <i>Her shoes had <b>acutely</b> pointed toes.</i>
<b><a href="#">adhere</a></b>	Believe in and follow the practices of. <i>The account <b>adhered</b> firmly to fact.</i>
<b><a href="#">adhesion</a></b>	The frictional grip of wheels, shoes, etc. on a surface. <i>The <b>adhesion</b> of Seville was decisive.</i>
<b><a href="#">affix</a></b>	A linguistic element added to a word to produce an inflected or derived form. <i>Grammatical morphemes <b>affix</b> to the stem.</i>
<b>append</b>	State or say further. <i><b>Append</b> a charm to the necklace.</i>
<b>attach</b>	Become attached. <i>I was <b>attached</b> to another working group.</i>
<b>attachment</b>	A writ authorizing the seizure of property that may be needed for the payment of a judgment in a judicial proceeding. <i><b>Attachment</b> to a formal agenda.</i>
<b>cleave</b>	Come or be in close contact with; stick or hold together and resist separation. <i><b>Cleave</b> the bone.</i>
<b><a href="#">cohere</a></b>	(of an argument or theory) be logically consistent. <i>He made the series of fictions <b>cohere</b> into a convincing sequence.</i>
<b>combine</b>	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i>One of the world's biggest food and personal products <b>combines</b>.</i>
<b>connect</b>	Make a logical or causal connection. <i>The desire for religious faith <b>connects</b> up with profound needs at the core of our existence.</i>

<b>decal</b>	A design prepared on special paper for durable transfer on to another surface such as glass or porcelain.
<b>despair</b>	The feeling that everything is wrong and nothing will turn out well. <i>We should not <b>despair</b>.</i>
<b>desperately</b>	With great urgency. <i>He looked around <b>desperately</b>.</i>
<b>glue</b>	Fasten or join with or as if with glue. <i>I was <b>glued</b> to the telly when the Olympics were on.</i>
<b>hang</b>	Be suspended or hanging. <i>He was <b>hanged</b> for murder.</i>
<b>hold</b>	Have or hold in one's hands or grip. <i>She <b>holds</b> a Master's degree from Harvard.</i>
<b>include</b>	Comprise or contain as part of a whole. <i>There were doubts as to whether she was <b>included</b> in the invitation.</i>
<b>incorporate</b>	Combine (ingredients) into one substance. <i>He has <b>incorporated</b> in his proposals a number of measures.</i>
<b>join</b>	Be or become joined or united or linked. <i>I <b>joined</b> the demonstration.</i>
<b>link</b>	Be or become joined or united or linked. <i>Foreign and domestic policy are <b>linked</b>.</i>
<b>relation</b>	Sexual intercourse. <i>International <b>relations</b>.</i>
<b>relatively</b>	Regarded in comparison with something else rather than absolutely; quite. <i>They were very poor but <b>relatively</b> speaking they had been lucky.</i>
<b>sorrow</b>	An event or circumstance that causes sorrow. <i>He drank to drown his <b>sorrows</b>.</i>
<b>sticker</b>	A particularly difficult or baffling question or problem. <i>Warning <b>stickers</b> on the glass.</i>
<b>stubbornly</b>	In a way that is difficult to move, remove, or improve. <i>She <b>stubbornly</b> refused to acknowledge my point of view.</i>
<b>tie</b>	A shoe tied with a lace. <i>His hand went up to his collar and started to loosen his <b>tie</b>.</i>
<b>viscous</b>	Having a relatively high resistance to flow. <i><b>Viscous</b> lava.</i>
<b>windshield</b>	A window at the front of the passenger compartment of a motor vehicle; a windscreen.
