accretion	Growth or increase by the gradual accumulation of additional layers or matter. <i>He scraped away the accretions of paint.</i>
acutely	In a shrewd manner. <i>Her shoes had acutely pointed toes.</i>
adhere	Believe in and follow the practices of. <i>The account adhered firmly to fact.</i>
adhesion	The frictional grip of wheels, shoes, etc. on a surface. <i>The adhesion of Seville was decisive.</i>
affix	A linguistic element added to a word to produce an inflected or derived form. <i>Grammatical morphemes affix to the stem.</i>
append	State or say further. <i>Append a charm to the necklace.</i>
attach	Become attached. <i>I was attached to another working group.</i>
attachment	A writ authorizing the seizure of property that may be needed for the payment of a judgment in a judicial proceeding. <i>Attachment to a formal agenda.</i>
cleave	Come or be in close contact with; stick or hold together and resist separation. <i>Cleave the bone.</i>
cohere	(of an argument or theory) be logically consistent. <i>He made the series of fictions cohere into a convincing sequence.</i>
combine	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i>One of the world s biggest food and personal products combines.</i>
connect	Make a logical or causal connection. <i>The desire for religious faith connects up with profound needs at the core of our existence.</i>

decal	A design prepared on special paper for durable transfer on to another surface such as glass or porcelain.
despair	The feeling that everything is wrong and nothing will turn out well. <i>We should not despair.</i>
desperately	With great urgency. <i>He looked around desperately.</i>
glue	Fasten or join with or as if with glue. <i>I was glued to the telly when the Olympics were on.</i>
hang	Be suspended or hanging. <i>He was hanged for murder.</i>
hold	Have or hold in one's hands or grip. <i>She holds a Master's degree from Harvard.</i>
include	Comprise or contain as part of a whole. <i>There were doubts as to whether she was included in the invitation.</i>
incorporate	Combine (ingredients) into one substance. <i>He has incorporated in his proposals a number of measures.</i>
join	Be or become joined or united or linked. <i>I joined the demonstration.</i>
link	Be or become joined or united or linked. <i>Foreign and domestic policy are linked.</i>
relation	Sexual intercourse. <i>International relations.</i>
relatively	Regarded in comparison with something else rather than absolutely; quite. <i>They were very poor but relatively speaking they had been lucky.</i>
sorrow	An event or circumstance that causes sorrow. <i>He drank to drown his sorrows.</i>
sticker	A particularly difficult or baffling question or problem. <i>Warning stickers on the glass.</i>
stubbornly	In a way that is difficult to move, remove, or improve. <i>She stubbornly refused to acknowledge my point of view.</i>
tie	A shoe tied with a lace. <i>His hand went up to his collar and started to loosen his tie.</i>
viscous	Having a relatively high resistance to flow. <i>Viscous lava.</i>
windshield	A window at the front of the passenger compartment of a motor vehicle; a windscreen.
