### Definitions of "Clipped" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “clipped” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Cut or trimmed by clipping.*
- *(of speech) having short, sharp vowel sounds and clear pronunciation.*
- *(of speech) having quick short sounds.*



## Synonyms of "Clipped" as an adjective (12 Words)

- abrupt** Steep; precipitous.  
*Abrupt* prose.
- blunt** Used of a knife or other blade; not sharp.  
*The blunt tip of the leaf.*
- brusque** Abrupt or offhand in speech or manner.  
*Try to cultivate a less brusque manner.*
- crisp** (of a way of speaking) briskly decisive and matter-of-fact, without hesitation or unnecessary detail.  
*A crisp retort.*
- monosyllabic** Having or characterized by or consisting of one syllable.  
*A monosyllabic footballer.*
- sharp** Of a key having a sharp or sharps in the signature.  
*A sharp worded exchange.*

<b>short</b>	Of a vowel categorized as short with regard to quality and length e g in standard British English the vowel in good is short as distinct from the long vowel u in food. <b>Short</b> in stature.
<b>snappish</b>	(of a dog) irritable and inclined to bite. She was often <b>snappish</b> with the children.
<b>snappy</b>	Smart and fashionable. <b>Snappy</b> catchphrases.
<b>summary</b>	Performed speedily and without formality. A <b>summary</b> execution.
<b>terse</b>	Brief and to the point; effectively cut short. Short and <b>terse</b> and easy to understand.

<b>audio</b>	The sound elements of television. <i>They always raise the <b>audio</b> for commercials.</i>
<b>beard</b>	Go along the rim like a beard around the chin. <i>The <b>beard</b> permitted the manipulator to protect the odds.</i>
<b>blockbuster</b>	A large bomb used to demolish extensive areas (as a city block). <i>A <b>blockbuster</b> film.</i>
<b>broadcast</b>	Broadcast over the airwaves as in radio or television. <i>We don't want to <b>broadcast</b> our unhappiness to the world.</i>
<b>camcorder</b>	A portable combined video camera and video recorder.
<b>camera</b>	Television equipment consisting of a lens system that focuses an image on a photosensitive mosaic that is scanned by an electron beam. <i>A photographer's <b>camera</b> flashed.</i>
<b>clipping</b>	The act of clipping or snipping. <i>He searched through piles of letters and <b>clippings</b>.</i>

<b>cutting</b>	The act of cutting something into parts. <i>An archive of newspaper <b>cuttings</b>.</i>
<b>drama</b>	A dramatic work intended for performance by actors on a stage. <i>Renaissance <b>drama</b>.</i>
<b>intersperse</b>	Place at intervals in or among. <i>Deep pools <b>interspersed</b> by shallow shingle banks.</i>
<b>newscaster</b>	Someone who broadcasts the news.
<b>pare</b>	Cut small bits or pare shavings from. <i><b>Pare</b> one's fingernails.</i>
<b>photographer</b>	A person who takes photographs, especially as a job. <i>A freelance press <b>photographer</b>.</i>
<b>playback</b>	A pre-recorded musical soundtrack mimed to by an actor. <i>We listened to several <b>playbacks</b> in the control room.</i>
<b>preview</b>	See or inspect (something) before it is used or becomes generally available. <i>I have photos of the goods if anyone would like a <b>preview</b>.</i>
<b>projector</b>	A promoter of a dubious or fraudulent enterprise. <i>He was a tobacco grower and <b>projector</b>.</i>
<b>razor</b>	Shave with a razor. <i>The tapered cut is <b>razored</b> to give movement.</i>
<b>recorder</b>	A judge in certain courts. <i>A <b>recorder</b> of rural life.</i>
<b>satellite</b>	Transmitted by satellite using or relating to satellite technology. <i>With good motorway and rail links <b>satellite</b> towns like Thornbury have grown rapidly.</i>
<b>shave</b>	Cut (a thin slice or slices) from the surface of something. <i>Scott <b>shaved</b> the post in the 29th minute.</i>
<b>shaving</b>	The action of shaving. <i><b>Shaving</b> foam.</i>
<b>shear</b>	Shear the wool from. <i>I'll <b>shear</b> off all that fleece.</i>
<b>snip</b>	An act of snipping something. <i>About 6 000 men get the <b>snip</b> every year and numbers are increasing.</i>
<b>snippet</b>	A small piece or brief extract. <i><b>Snippets</b> of information about the war.</i>
<b>tape</b>	Record sound or pictures on audio or video tape or by digital means. <i>A <b>tape</b> of a radio talk.</i>



- television** An electronic device that receives television signals and displays them on a screen.  
*A **television** camera.*
- trim** Adjust the balance of a ship or aircraft by rearranging its cargo or by means of its trim tabs.  
*The buildings were off white with a blue **trim**.*
- tv** Broadcasting visual images of stationary or moving objects - Ernie Kovacs.  
*The British call a **tv** set a telly.*
- video** Make a video recording of something broadcast on television.  
*A **video** library.*
- whittle** English aeronautical engineer who invented the jet aircraft engine (1907-1996).  
***Whittle** a piece of wood.*
